“We Have Found the Messiah” John 1:41

On this second Sunday in Ordinary Time, our hearts rejoice in the Lord Jesus because we truly believe he is the Messiah, the one who has come, the Son of God.

There is great joy in finding Jesus, as I said this past Sunday during my homily. Jesus passes by or crosses the paths of the lives of so many people who are not interested in him. But there are also so many who really want to follow him, as do these two fishermen from the Gospel. He has the power to touch and transform our lives.

Today we see Jesus’ walking along the banks of the Jordan. Christ is passing by! It was sometime in the afternoon when he notices two young men following him and he turns to ask, “What are you looking for?” This is an amazing question for us to meditate upon today. What are you looking for when you come to church? What are you looking for while you are journeying with us? Do you look for a liberator, or for the Messiah?

In today’s Gospel, Jesus is not satisfied with their answer. They took a different way. They did not answer his question but instead asked, “Where are you staying?” Like these disciples, we often look for proof. He is patient towards them, and he answers, “Come and you will see.”

Oh, we are so miserable as humans. We want to see—we are so experiential that we need to see! Jesus’ love for us is so great that he always shows us his love even when we do not deserve it. I am sure that their lives were impacted by his words and presence to the point that they decided to stay with him. This is what Jesus wants from us, also; to stay with Him, to remain in Him, and to believe in Him. Can you do it today?

We are in constant search for the meaning of our lives. We search for Jesus in places we should not; we follow our ideas or sometimes other people instead of following Jesus. We follow ourselves without realizing that he is right here always waiting for us. We don’t see—we don’t want to see—that at the end, we are only looking for ourselves because for so long we have been the center of attention and not the Lord. During this Ordinary Time, my dear brothers and sisters, I invite you to follow Jesus closely, to see where he lives, to make an introspection and find Him right there in your heart. Let Him encounter you!

Like Andrew, we are called to hear John and to share the good news with our brothers and sisters of our personal encounter with the Lord. This testimony may impact the lives of others; sometimes many words are not needed.

Very soon we are going to enter the Lenten season and Jesus will make a more radical invitation to follow Him. He is going to Jerusalem; are you ready to follow? He wants to show you the power of his love and mission. I will never forget our trip to Jerusalem with our brother priests when we visited the Church of the Primacy of Peter where Simon the son of John encountered Jesus who said, “You will be Cephas” (Jn 1:42) which means rock and “Upon this rock I will build my church.”

“What Christ entrusted to the apostles they in turn handed on by their preaching and writing under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit to all generations, until Christ returns in glory.” (CCC 96)

Jesus is the cornerstone, but he has come to build his church with living stones. Simon will be the rock on which the whole edifice rests and like him we are not prepared to understand these words, probably because, as Peter knows, we are not the best. But a great reminder for you and for me is that God doesn’t always choose the best.

“Hemos encontrado al Mesías” Jn 1:41

El segundo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, nuestros corazones se regocijan en el Señor Jesús porque realmente creemos que Él es el Mesías, el que ha venido, el Hijo de Dios.

Hay una gran alegría en encontrar a Jesús, como dije el domingo pasado durante mi homilía. Jesús pasa o se cruza en los caminos de la vida de tantas personas que no están interesadas en él, pero también hay tantos que realmente quieren seguirlo como este pescador. Él tiene el poder de tocar y transformar nuestras vidas.

Hoy vemos a Jesús caminando por las orillas del Jordán. ¡Cristo está pasando! Era cerca de la tarde cuando al ver a dos jóvenes siguiéndolo, se volteó a preguntar, ¿qué buscas?

Esta es una pregunta increíble para que meditemos hoy. ¿Qué buscas cuando vienes a la iglesia? ¿Qué buscas mientras viajas con nosotros? ¿Buscas un libertador o al Mesías?

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús no está satisfecho con su respuesta. Tomaron un camino diferente, no respondieron a su pregunta, sino que le preguntaron: “¿Dónde te quedas?” En este discípulo buscamos pruebas. Es paciente con ellos, les dice: “Venid y veréis”.

¡Oh, miserables somos como humanos, queremos ver, somos tan experimentales que necesitamos ver! El amor de Jesús por nosotros es tan grande que siempre nos muestra su amor, incluso cuando no lo merecemos. Estoy seguro de que sus vidas se vieron impactadas por sus palabras y su presencia hasta el punto de que decidieron quedarse con él. Esto es lo que Jesús quiere de nosotros también. Permanecer con Él, permanecer en Él y crearle. ¿Puedes hacerlo hoy?

Estamos en constante búsqueda del sentido de nuestras vidas, buscamos a Jesús en lugares donde no deberíamos, seguimos nuestras ideas; a veces las personas en lugar de seguir a Jesús, nos seguimos a nosotros mismos sin darnos cuenta de que Él está aquí siempre esperándonos. No vemos, no queremos ver que al final, solo nos estamos buscando a nosotros mismos porque durante tanto tiempo hemos sido el centro de atención y no el Señor. En este Tiempo Ordinario, queridos hermanos y hermanas, los invito a seguir de cerca a Jesús, a ver dónde vive, a hacer una introspección y a encontrarlo allí mismo, en nuestros corazones. ¡Deja que Él te encuentre!

Al igual que Andrés, estamos llamados a escuchar a Juan y a llevar a nuestros hermanos la buena noticia de nuestro encuentro personal con el Señor. Este testimonio puede tener un impacto en la vida de otras personas; A veces no se necesitan muchas palabras.

Muy pronto vamos a entrar en el tiempo de Cuaresma y Jesús hará una invitación más radical a seguirlo; Va a Jerusalén. ¿Estás listo? Él quiere mostrarte el poder de su amor y misión. Nunca olvidaré nuestro viaje a Jerusalén con nuestros hermanos sacerdotes en la Iglesia del Primado de Pedro, donde Simón, hijo de Juan; ¿Me quieres? Entonces dice: “Tú serás Cefas” (Jn 1,42), que significa roca, y sobre esta piedra edificaré mi iglesia.

“Lo que Cristo confió a los apóstoles, ellos a su vez lo transmitieron por su predicación y escritura bajo la inspiración del Espíritu Santo a todas las generaciones, hasta que Cristo regrese en gloria”. (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, N0 96)

Jesús es la piedra angular, pero ha venido a edificar su iglesia en piedras vivas. Simón será la roca sobre la que descansa todo el edificio y, como él, no estamos preparados para entender estas palabras, probablemente porque, como Pedro sabe, no somos los mejores. Pero un gran recordatorio para ti y para mí es que Dios no siempre elige lo mejor.

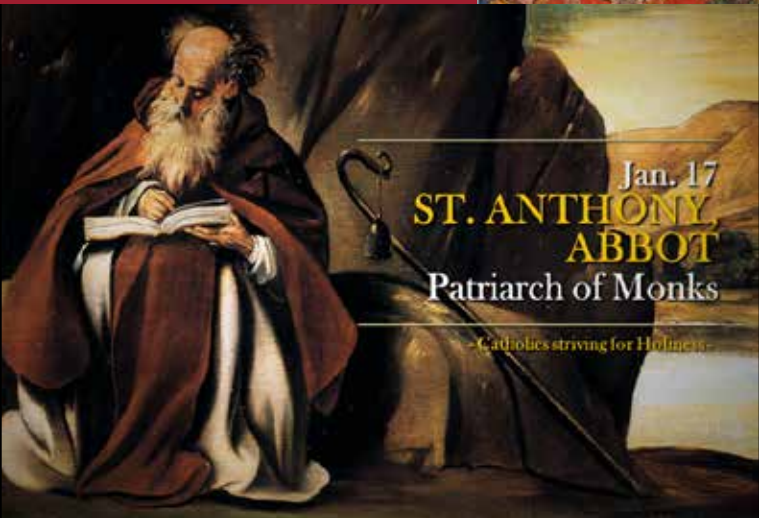

Asceticism and prayer
 His life was marked by solitude, fasting and work. Orphaned at 20, as a young man he gave all his goods to the poor and retired to the desert, where he also fought against the temptations of the devil, choosing the path of asceticism and prayer. Anthony was responsible for the establishment of families of monks who, under the guidance of a spiritual father, consecrated themselves to the service of God.

Saint Anthony and the blessing of animals
 St. Anthony is often depicted next to a pig with a bell around its neck. This iconographic representation is linked to the fact that the ancient hospitaller order of the "Antonines" raised pigs because the fat of these animals was used to anoint the sick affected by ergotism. This disease was then called "the fire of Sant 'Antonio". On his feast day, the stalls are blessed, as are any domestic animals brought for blessing. In the iconography is associated with St. Anthony figures also the hermit's staff in the form of T, the tau, the last letter of the Hebrew alphabet.

A gift from God
 In the biography Vita Antonii, St. Athanasius wrote these words referring to St. Anthony: "That he was everywhere known, admired and desired by everyone, even those who had not seen him, is a sign of his virtue and God-friendly soul. In fact, neither for writings nor for a profane wisdom nor for any capacity is Anthony known, but only for his piety towards God - and no one could deny that this is a gift from God. As indeed we would not have heard in Spain and in Gaul, in Rome and in Africa of this man, who lived withdrawn in the mountains, if God Himself had not made him known to all, as He does with those who belong to Him, and as He had announced to Anthony since the beginning? Even if Anthony acted in secret and desired to remain hidden, the Lord shows him and those like him to everyone, as a lamp, that those who hear about them know that it is possible to follow the commandments and take courage in following the path of virtue."

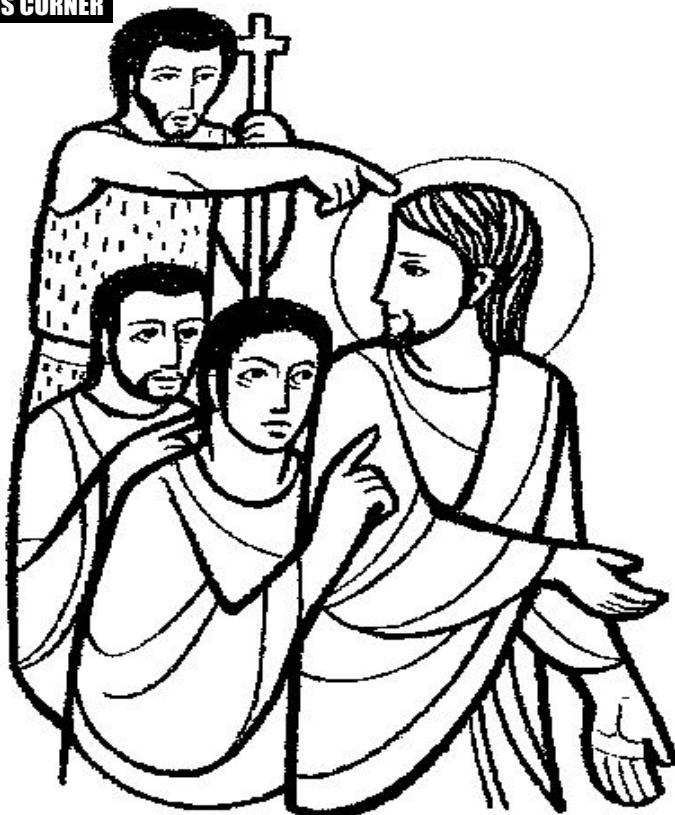

Pope renews prayers for people suffering horrors of war

Pope Francis appeals for an end to all wars, and prays that God might sow the seed of peace in the hearts of world leaders.

As he led his Wednesday General Audience, Pope Francis re-launched his appeal for peace in our war-torn world. In his greetings to the Italian-speaking faithful, he expressed his solidarity with the people of countries that are enduring the horrors of war. "We renew our prayerful closeness to the dear Ukrainian population so harshly tried and to those who suffer the horror of war in Palestine and Israel, as well as in other parts of the world," he said. The Pope also encouraged all people to pray for nations at war. "Let us pray for these people who are enduring war," he said, "and let us pray to the Lord that He may sow the seed of peace in the hearts of the authorities of the countries."

Papal concern for global crises

Pope Francis has made his appeals for peace a near-constant refrain in his public audiences. On Monday, he held his annual "State of the World" address to Ambassadors accredited to the Holy See, detailing his concerns regarding global issues. The Israel-Hamas war in Gaza and Russia's war in Ukraine topped his list of situations that require global attention and concern. At the same time, he condemned the "enormous stock of available weapons" that offer the illusion of deterrence. "The contrary is true: the availability of weapons encourages their use and increases their production," said the Pope. "Weapons create mistrust and divert resources."

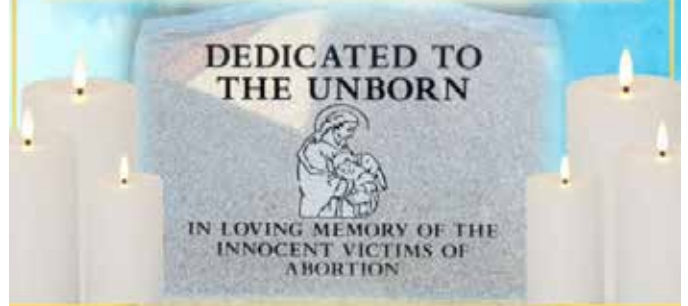
