

# From the **Pastor**

"Jesus taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes." Mark 1:21-28

Brothers and Sisters: Today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus' teaching is a teaching of authority, therefore it is necessary that we listen to him. Why do I always go to the historical context of the Scriptural passage? Because it really illustrates and helps us to understand His message better. Also, it is true that sometimes, we are wrong in the way we interpret Scripture.

As we all know, to the Jews the Torah is the most sacred thing in the world—the must supreme rule of faith and life. The torah is expressed in great, wide principles, but it contains direction and guidance for all life. The great laws must become rules and regulations. To give guidance and to supply development, a class of scholars arose. These were the scribes, the experts in the law, and the title of the greatest of them was Rabbi. The scribes had three duties:

- (i) They set themselves, out of the great moral principles of the Torah, to extract rules and regulations from every possible situation in life.
- (ii) It was the task of the scribes to transmit and to teach this law and its developments.
- (iii) They had the duty of giving judgement in individual cases; and in things, practically every individual's case must have produced a new law.

Wherein did Jesus's teaching differ so much from the teaching of the scribes? He taught with personal authority. No scribe ever gave a decision on his own. He would always begin, "There is a teaching that..." and would then quote all his authorities and the next quotation from the great legal masters of the past. The last thing he ever gave was an independent judgement. How different was Jesus! When he spoke, he spoke as if he needed no authority beyond himself. He spoke with utter independence. He cited no authorities beyond himself and quoted no experts. To the experts, he spoke with the finality of the voice of God.

"To the minds of the people, it was like breeze from heaven to hear someone speak with the terrific, positive certainty of the scribes. The note of personal authority rang out-and that is a note which captures the ear of every man." The Gospel of Mathew, William Barclay, pp. 29-30.

Dear fellow brothers and sisters: In days when we question everything—even authorities—it is necessary that we understand that Jesus's authority is one of Lordship, with which he taught, healed, and heard the people. This Lordship, that came from within, reveals the consistency between his teaching and his actions.

We as Catholics need to be consistent with what we preach and our actions. How many times have we reflected on the importance of this? Sadly, there is a great discrepancy between these two important categories that must be intrinsically united. Jesus admonishes the people, "Do what they say but not what they do."

As priests and servants of the Lord we have a great pastoral responsibility. Today I ask the Lord to grant us the grace to persevere in faithfulness to the teachings of Jesus. The hypocrisy of the scribes is not just a temptation for priests, but for all those who are in ministry and are given a little bit of responsibility! Authority does not consist in commanding and making oneself heard, but in being consistent between what we teach and the way we live and treat others.

Jesus commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him, What about you and me? Do we follow and obey Jesus? The Pharisees and Scribes wanted to remove Jesus' authority and ridiculed him so many times because they felt threatened, challenged, and embarrassed. They were not consistent! Pope Francis once said that authority in preaching comes from loving as Jesus did.

In so far as the Authority of the Church, we need submission and intellectual humility to remember that the Church is guided by the Holy Spirit and that the powers of the netherworld will never prevail upon her. We are not the ones in control—it is God, It does not mean that we cannot dialogue or ask, but when we fall into the prideful attitude and believe that we are the experts there is a problem. We have a role in the protection of the teachings of our Lord Jesus but also the mission to imitate Him.

# Del **Párroco**

"Jesús les enseñó como quien tiene autoridad y no como los escribas". Marcos 1:21-28

Hermanos y hermanas: El Evangelio de hoy nos recuerda que la enseñanza de Jesús es una enseñanza de autoridad, por lo tanto, es necesario que lo escuchemos. ¿Por qué siempre voy al contexto histórico del pasaje de las Escrituras? Porque realmente ilustra y nos ayuda a entender mejor su mensaje. Además, es cierto que a veces nos equivocamos en la forma en que interpretamos las Escrituras

Como todos sabemos, para los judíos la Torá es lo más sagrado del mundo, la regla suprema de la fe y la vida. La Torá se expresa en grandes y amplios principios, pero contiene dirección y guía para toda la vida. Las grandes leyes deben convertirse en reglas y reglamentos. Para orientar y proporcionar desarrollo, surgió una clase de eruditos. Estos eran los escribas, los expertos en la ley, y el título del más grande de ellos era Rabí. Los escribas tenían tres deberes:

- (i) Se proponen, a partir de los grandes principios morales de la Torá, extraer reglas y regulaciones de todas las situaciones posibles de la vida.
- (ii) Era tarea de los escribas transmitir y enseñar esta ley y sus desarrollos.
- (iii) Tenían el deber de juzgar en casos individuales; y en las cosas, prácticamente el caso de cada individuo debe haber producido una nueva ley.

¿En qué difería tanto la enseñanza de Jesús de la enseñanza de los escribas? Enseñaba con autoridad personal. Ningún escriba ha tomado nunca una decisión por su cuenta. Siempre comenzaba: "Hay una enseñanza que..." y luego citaba todas sus autoridades y la siguiente cita de los grandes maestros del derecho del pasado. Lo último que dio fue un juicio independiente. ¡Qué diferente era Jesús! Cuando hablaba, lo hacía como si no necesitara más autoridad que él mismo. Hablaba con total independencia. No citó a ninguna autoridad más allá de él y no citó a ningún experto. A los expertos, les habló con la firmeza de la voz de Dios. "Para la mente de la gente, era como una brisa del cielo oír a alguien hablar con la certeza terrible y positiva de los escribas. La nota de la autoridad personal resonó, y esa es una nota que capta el oído de todos los hombres. El Evangelio de Mateo, William Barclay, pp. 29-30.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas: En los días en que cuestionamos todo, incluso las autoridades, es necesario que entendamos que la autoridad de Jesús es una autoridad de Señorio, con la que enseñó, sanó y escuchó a la gente. Este señorio, que vino de adentro, revela la coherencia entre su enseñanza y sus acciones. Nosotros, como católicos, debemos ser coherentes con lo que predicamos y con nuestras acciones. ¿Cuántas veces hemos reflexionado sobre la importancia de esto? Lamentablemente, existe una gran discrepancia entre estas dos importantes categorías que deben estar intrínsecamente unidas. Jesús amonesta a la gente: "Haced lo que dicen, pero no lo que hacen".

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Como sacerdotes y siervos del Señor tenemos una gran responsabilidad pastoral. Hoy pido al Señor que nos conceda la gracia de perseverar en la fidelidad a las enseñanzas de Jesús. La hipocresía de los escribas no es solo una tentación para los sacerdotes, sino para todos aquellos que están en el ministerio y se les da un poco de responsabilidad. La autoridad no consiste en mandar y hacerse oír, sino en ser coherentes entre lo que enseñamos y la forma en que vivimos y tratamos a los demás.

Jesús manda incluso a los espíritus inmundos y ellos le obedecen: ¿Y tú y yo? ¿Seguimos y obedecemos a Jesús? Los fariseos y los escribas querían quitarle la autoridad a Jesús y lo ridiculizaron tantas veces porque se sentían amenazados, desafiados y avergonzados. ¡No fueron consistentes! El Papa Francisco dijo una vez que la autoridad en la predicación proviene de amar como lo hizo Jesús. En cuanto a la Autoridad de la Iglesia, necesitamos sumisión y humildad intelectual para recordar que la Iglesia es guiada por el Espíritu Santo y que los poderes del inframundo nunca prevalecerán sobre ella. No somos nosotros los que tenemos el control, es Dios, no significa que no podamos dialogar o preguntar, pero cuando caemos en la actitud orgullosa y creemos que somos los expertos hay un problema. Tenemos un papel en la protección de las enseñanzas de nuestro Señor Jesús, pero también en la misión de imitarlo.

# Pope Francis:

The Pope's preface introduces Cardinal Angelo Comastri's "Praying Today. A Challenge to Be Overcome", which was published by the Vatican Publishing House (LEV) in connection with the Year of Prayer.

"Prayer is the breath of faith; it is its most proper expression," writes Pope Francis.

It is not easy to find words to express the mystery of prayer, continues the Pope, adding that despite the many definitions from saints and masters of spirituality, "it can only ever be described in the simplicity of those who live it."





# Fr. Faltas: 'Women are weavers of peace'

The Vicar of Custody of Holy Land, Fr. Ibrahim Faltas, writes an article for L'Osservatore Romano, insisting that women are great witnesses and weavers of peace, as two women are killed every hour in Gaza.



"He who harms a woman

profanes God." Pope Francis spoke these words during his homily at the Mass for the World Day of Peace, on 1 January.

I thought of these words as I read a recent UN report: since 7 October, two women have been killed every hour in Gaza, and women and children account for 70 percent of the deaths.

On Saturday, a pregnant woman was seriously injured during a bombing; doctors managed to deliver the baby while the mother died.

I thought back to the words of the Pope: "...profane God, because He was born of a woman."

Mary Most Holy was the link between earth and heaven: she listened and accepted God's will; she accepted the consequences; she was an attentive, discreet and suffering mother. What an example and what a model for all women, believers and non-believers, mothers and consecrated!

The Holy Father often calls us to respect the role of women both in the Church and in civil society.

I am convinced that women with their inner strength and dedication to their neighbour are indispensable for building peace in the world.

I see in women the determination of those who know no selfishness, those who care for every aspect of common life, those who wisely choose the good to improve themselves and their neighbour.

We must allow ourselves to be guided by the hearts of mothers and women who look at humanity with attentive and silent eyes, who offer their suffering for the good of others, who sense needs and anticipate them with complete dedication.

By the grace of God, I had my mother as an example of a woman of faith, who, in silence and sacrifice, dedicated her life to her children, her family, and the poor.

Women are capable of being weavers of peace; they do not resign themselves to evil; they seek to heal and protect; they know how to manage resources and relationships; they never let true love be lacking, the love that does not die of indifference or forgetfulness.

That love that the Lord will not fail that little girl in Gaza, born already an orphan, but with the strength drawn from her mother's womb, who had welcomed and loved her before seeing her and being able to hold her in her arms.

Let us not forget these innocent victims—the dead and the survivors—and let us not forget the love of mothers and the strength of women.

Let us respect, protect, and defend the dignity of women to make this humanity better and to defeat hatred and violence.

# Haitians to pray for release of six nuns and all hostages

Church leaders in Haiti announce a day of prayer to be held on Wednesday to implore the unconditional release of six nuns abducted on January 19 and all hostages held by gangs.

Three days after the abduction of six nuns and two of their companions travelling with them in Portau-Prince, the leaders of the Haitian bishops and religious have again appealed the kidnappers for their immediate release.

The Bishop also invited Haitians to join in a day of prayer for all hostages in Haiti on January 24.

The nuns from the Congregation of the Sisters of Sainte-Anne were abducted on a minibus in the Haitian capital on 19 January, along with the



driver and another passenger, the niece of one of the nuns, who was reportedly released late on Monday evening with no ransom paid

Firm condemnation of the kidnapping

In a strongly-worded press statement issued on Monday, Archbishop Max Leroys Mesidor of Portau-Prince, president of the Bishops' Conference of Haiti, and Father Morachel Bonhomme, president of the Haitian Conference of religious, reiterated the Church's firm condemnation of the kidnapping.

The abduction is the latest in a long series of crimes committed by armed gangs that have virtually taken over the country.

None of the 300 gangs operating in Haiti so far has publicly claimed responsibility for the abduction, though local media alleged that a ransom of 3 million dollars has been demanded.


The Church leaders pleaded for the unconditional release of the nuns and and of all the hostages held captive in the island.
















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
