

# "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."

(Psalms 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23)

The Lord is risen, Alleluia! Death has no power! Let us sing with the psalmist the greatness of the Lord: "Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his mercy endures forever. I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the LORD." The alleluia is one of the most joyful songs we can sing, and it has the power to remind us that despite our many sufferings there is hope; there is salvation; there is a great God who has defeated Satan and death.

Happy Easter dear fellow Brothers and Sisters. This past year has been a difficult year. After the pandemic, we contemplated the departure of our beloved ones. Now we see the venom and poison of death and injustices affecting the most vulnerable—the defenseless and innocent. Let us not be discouraged! God—our God—is not indifferent to our sufferings and trials, and now more than ever he is close to us. Death does not have the final word.

I invite you to become witnesses to the resurrection, like the disciples and Mary Magdalene. This is what our society needs, and this is what our community needs; witnesses like the apostles, Mother Cabrini, and many other saints who have inspired us. However, this call is urgent; as Mary we need to run, as Peter we need to go out, as the other disciple we need to run fast and bring the good news to those who hope in the Lord. Moreover, we need to see, believe, and experience the power of resurrection in our lives. How can you be a witness to something or someone that you have not seen, and how can you be a witness if you do not believe?

In this Sunday's Gospel, we contemplate Mary of Magdala going to the tomb early in the morning. According to some theologians, no one loved Jesus as much as Mary Magdalene. He had done something for her that no one else could ever do and she would never forget. Tradition has always had it that Mary was a scarlet sinner, whom Jesus reclaimed and forgave and purified. Mary had sinned much, and she loved much; and love was all she had to bring. (The Gospel of John, William Barclay. Pp. 264, 265)

As we acknowledge ourselves as sinners, I pray that the Lord grants us the grace to imitate Mary Magdalene in her love of Jesus. You may think that there is not enough water in the world to make you clean again, but Jesus can make everything new, and Mary Magdalene is the perfect example that in Christ and through Christ everything is possible. Today you can see that through the waters of baptism we are made clean again. I plead with you; never, ever give up hope. Jesus has come, he is always coming, and he will come again.

Feliz Pascua queridos hermanos y hermanas, este último año ha sido un año difícil durante y después de la pandemia contemplamos la partida de nuestros seres queridos, ahora hemos visto el veneno (venenoso) de la muerte y las injusticias que afectan a los más vulnerables, a los indefensos e inocentes, ¡no nos desanimemos! Dios, nuestro Dios, no es indiferente a nuestros sufrimientos y pruebas, más que nunca, está cerca de nosotros. La muerte no es la última palabra.

Los invito como a los discípulos y a María Magdalena a ser testigos de la resurrección, que es lo que necesita nuestra sociedad, esto es lo que necesita nuestra comunidad; testigos que, como los apóstoles, la Madre Cabrini y muchos otros santos han sido para nosotros. Sin embargo, el llamado es urgente, como María necesitamos correr, como Pedro necesitamos salir, como el otro discípulo necesitamos correr más rápido y llevar la buena nueva a los que esperan en el Señor. Además, necesitamos ver y creer en pocas palabras y experimentar el poder de la resurrección en nuestras vidas. ¿Cómo puedes ser testigo de algo o alguien que no has visto y cómo puedes ser testigo si no creemos?

En el Evangelio de este domingo contemplamos a María Magdalena yendo al sepulcro temprano en la mañana. Según algunos teólogos, nadie amó tanto a Jesús como María Magdalena. Había hecho algo por ella que nadie más podría hacer y que ella nunca olvidaría. La tradición siempre ha dicho que María era una pecadora escarlata, a quien Jesús reclamó, perdonó y purificó. María había pecado mucho, y amaba mucho; Y el amor era todo lo que tenía para traer. El Evangelio de Juan, William Barclay. Págs. 264 y 265.

Al reconocernos como pecadores, ruego que el Señor nos conceda la gracia de imitar a María Magdalena en su amor por Jesús, que piensen que no hay suficiente agua en el mundo para limpiar de nuevo, pero Jesús puede hacer todo nuevo, y María Magdalena es el ejemplo perfecto de que en Cristo y a través de Cristo todo es posible. Hoy puedes ver que a través de las aguas del bautismo somos limpiados de nuevo. Les ruego que nunca, nunca pierdan la esperanza. Jesús ha venido, siempre vendrá y vendrá de nuevo.





## What is Easter?



The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East." The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth, and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world. The Paschal Candle used during the Easter Vigil is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time and lit for all liturgical celebrations.

The Easter Vigil is the "Mother of All Vigils" and Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Sundays. The season of Easter is the most important of all liturgical times, which Catholics celebrate as the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. The octave of Easter comprises the eight days which stretch from the first to the second Sunday. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. There are 50 days of Easter from the first Sunday to Pentecost. It is characterized, abo ve all, by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Christian: Alleluia! All faith flows from faith in the resurrection: "If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith." (1 Cor 15:14)

"What you sow is not brought to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body that is to be, but a bare kernel of wheat, perhaps, or of some other kind;...So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown corruptible; it is raised incorruptible. It is sown dishonorable; it is raised glorious. It is sown weak; it is raised powerful. It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual one. So, too, it is written, "The first man, Adam, became a living being," the last Adam a life-giving spirit. But the spiritual was not first; rather the natural and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, earthly; the second man, from heaven. As was the earthly one, so also are the earthly, and as is the heavenly one, so also are the heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one." (1 Cor 15:36-37, 42-49)

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

### ST. CASIMIR, PATRON OF LITHUANIA

Born in 1458, St Casimir was of Lithuanian origin, the son of the King of Poland. He renounced the crown of Hungary at the urging of the Pope, and refused an arranged marriage designed to expand his realms. St Casimir was only 25 when he died, having overcome the seductions of power and luxury.



### Pope to Catholics in Holy Land: May hope arise from seeds sown in pain

In an Easter Letter addressed to Catholics in the Holy Land, Pope Francis expresses his spiritual closeness and paternal affection, and encourages Christians around the world to offer concrete support and prayers for peace.

Pope Francis has written to Catholics in the Holy Land, assuring them that they are daily in his thoughts and prayers. "I embrace all of you, in the variety of your rites, dear Catholic faithful living throughout the Holy Land," he writes, adding, "In a particular way, I embrace those most affected by the senseless tragedy of war: the children robbed of

The Pope goes on to share the prayer he offers for and with the Christians of the Holy Land:

Lord, you are our peace (cf. Eph 2:14-22). You who proclaimed blessed the peacemakers (cf. Mt 5:9): set human hearts free from hatred, violence, and the spirit of revenge. We look to Your example and we follow You, Who are merciful, meek, and humble of heart (cf. Mt 11:29). May no one rob our hearts of the hope of rising anew with You. May we never tire of defending the dignity of every man, woman, and child, without distinction of religion, ethnicity, or nationality, beginning with the most vulnerable among us: women, the elderly, children, and the poor.

Assuring them once again that they are not alone, the Pope promises that the universal Church will demonstrate solidarity through "prayer and practical charity."

"Soon we hope to return among you as pilgrims, to draw near to you, to embrace you, to break with you the bread of fraternity, and to contemplate the tender



and resurrection.

Acknowledging the desire of Christians to remain in the lands they have dwelt in for centuries, Pope Francis says it is good that they should remain, and thanks them for their faith, charity, and hope. The Pope goes on to recall his own pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2014, and repeats the words of Saint Paul VI, who warned of the "constant and dire threat" to peace and security, and to human values, of continuing tensions in the Middle East.

Pope Francis highlights the role of Christians in the Middle East in guarding the "places of our salvation," as well as their "enduring witness, through [their] sufferings, to the mystery of the Lord's Passion." "By your ability to rise anew and press forward," he writes, "you have proclaimed, and continue to proclaim, that the crucified Lord rose from the

shoots of hope that spring from the seeds you are sowing in pain and nurturing with patience," he says.

Then, after thanking the "bishops, priests, and religious" for their work among the people, the Holy Father prays that "in the crucible of suffering... the precious gold of unity may be purified and shine forth" among Catholics and with other Christians, to whom he expresses his "spiritual closeness and encouragement" and assuring them of his prayers.

Concluding his letter, Pope Francis invokes upon Catholics in the Holy Land the protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary, "daughter of your Land." And he calls on Christians throughout the world "to manifest their concrete support for you and pray tirelessly that all the people of your beloved land may dwell at last in peace."

### Francisco a los católicos de Tierra Santa: Gracias porque saben esperar contra toda esperanza

En una carta dirigida a los fieles de todos los ritos y confesiones que se preparan para celebrar la Pascua, Francisco expresa cercanía, afecto y aliento a quienes "están sufriendo dolorosamente el drama absurdo de la guerra".

"Gracias por su testimonio de fe, gracias por la caridad que existe entre ustedes, gracias porque saben esperar contra toda esperanza". Así lo escribe el Papa Francisco en una carta a los católicos de Tierra Santa con vistas a la Pascua, que algunas comunidades celebran el 31 de marzo, según el calendario gregoriano, y otras, el 5 de mayo, según el calendario juliano.

Pienso en ti, rezo por ti y te llevo en mi corazón.

El Papa desea hacer sentir su cercanía a los fieles y su "cariño paternal", en particular, a quienes en los últimos meses "están sufriendo más dolorosamente el absurdo drama de la guerra, a los niños a los que se les niega un futuro, a cuantos lloran y sufren" y "experimentan angustia y desconcierto". El Papa escribe:

Desde hace tiempo los llevo en mi pensamiento y rezo cada día por ustedes. Pero ahora, en vísperas de esta Pascua, que para ustedes tiene una fuerte carga de Pasión y todavía poco de Resurrección, siento la necesidad de escribirles y decirles que los llevo en el corazón.

Tierra Santa, testimonio de la Pasión y la Resurrección El Papa recuerda la peregrinación que realizó en mayo de 2014 y hace suyas las palabras de San Pablo VI, primer Pontífice peregrino a Tierra Santa hace 50 años, cuando subrayó el peligro para la paz en todo el mundo de la continuación de las tensiones en el Oriente Medio. Francisco afirma que Tierra Santa no sólo ha sido "custodia de los Lugares de salvación", sino testimonio constante, "a través de sus propios sufrimientos" de la Pasión del Señor, y junto, "con su capacidad de levantarse y seguir adelante, ha anunciado y sigue anunciando que el Crucificado resucitó". El Papa escribe:

En estos tiempos oscuros, en los que parece que las tinieblas del Viernes Santo recubren vuestra tierra y tantas partes del mundo son desfiguradas por la inútil locura de la guerra, que es siempre y para todos una sangrienta derrota, ustedes son antorchas encendidas en la noche; son semillas de bien en una tierra desgarrada por los conflictos.

Que nadie nos robe la esperanza


Francisco renueva su oración al Señor que es "nuestra paz" para que libere "el corazón del hombre del odio, de la violencia y de la venganza" y continúa:

Que nadie nos robe del corazón la esperanza de ponernos en pie y de resucitar contigo, haz que no nos cansemos de afirmar la dignidad de todo hombre, sin distinción de religión, etnia o nacionalidad, empezando por los más frágiles, por las mujeres, los ancianos, los pequeños y los pobres.

Que crezca también la unidad entre todos los cristianos Mientras asegura a los católicos "no están solos y no los dejaremos solos, sino que permaneceremos solidarios con ustedes a través de la oración y la caridad activa", el Papa expresa la esperanza "poder volver pronto a ustedes como peregrinos, para mirarlos a los ojos y abrazarlos". Agradece a los Pastores, religiosos y religiosas que acompañan con su cercanía a los fieles y recomienda: Que crezca y resplandezca en el crisol del sufrimiento el oro de la unidad, también con los hermanos y las hermanas de las otras confesiones cristianas, a quienes asimismo les deseo manifestar mi

Finalmente, el Papa Francisco renueva la invitación "a todos los cristianos del mundo" a apoyar concretamente y orar con insistencia "para que toda la población de vuestra querida tierra esté por fin en paz".

# Young people are the living hope of a missionary church, pope says

Young people need to understand how much Christ loves them unconditionally and how much the church needs their voices and presence, Pope Francis said.

"Dear young people, you are the living hope of a Church on the move! For this reason, I thank you for your presence and for your contribution to the life of the Body of Christ," the pope told the world's young people in a written message.

The pope's message was released by the Vatican March 25 to mark the fifth anniversary of his apostolic exhortation "Christus Vivit" ("Christ is Alive"), published in 2019 and reflecting on the 2018 Synod of Bishops on young people, the faith and vocational discernment.



Pope Francis said he wanted to reach out again to young people with a message that could be "a source of renewed hope for you."

Christ is alive, he said in his message, and "his love for you is unaffected by your failings or your mistakes. He gave his life for you, so in his love for you he does not wait for you to be perfect."

"Walk with him as with a friend, welcome him into your life and let him share all the joys and hopes, the problems and struggles of this time in your lives," the pope wrote. "You will see that the path ahead will become clearer and that your difficulties will be much less burdensome, because he will be carrying them with you."

"In today's world, marked by so many conflicts and so much suffering, I suspect that many of you feel disheartened. So together with you, I would like to set out from the proclamation that is the basis of our hope and that of all humanity: 'Christ is alive!'" he wrote, and "he loves you with an infinite love."

"How greatly I want this proclamation to reach every one of you, for you to accept it as living and true in your own lives, and feel the desire to share it with your friends!" the pope wrote.

Pope Francis noted that April 14 will mark the 40th anniversary of the first great gathering of young people that, during St. John Paul II's Holy Year of the Redemption, "was the seed of the future World Youth Days."

Pope Francis recalled his first World Youth Day as pope in Rio de Janeiro in 2013, and how "I urged you to make your voices heard! 'Hagan lio!' Make a mess!"

"Today, once again, I ask you: make your voices heard! Proclaim, not so much in words but by your life and your heart, the truth that Christ is alive! And in this way, help the whole Church to get up and set out ever anew to bring his message to the entire world," he wrote.

He encouraged young people to never "leave us without your good way of 'making a mess,' your drive, like that of a clean and well-tuned engine, and your own particular way of living and proclaiming the joy of the risen Jesus!"


