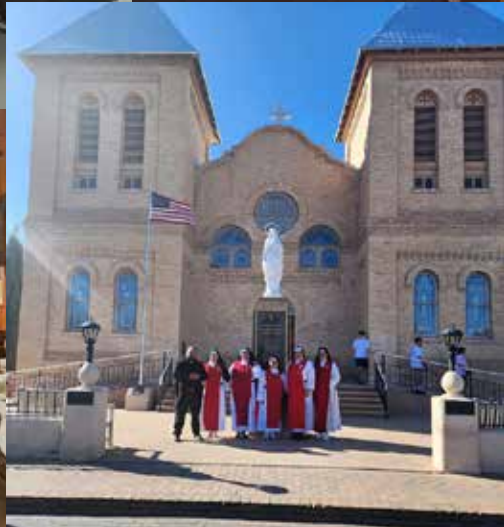

**“Have you anything here to eat?
They gave him a piece of baked fish;
he took it and ate it in front of them.”**

Luke 24:35-48

Dear Friends: In today’s Gospel we contemplate how Jesus came to his own while they were gathered in the upper room. I don’t know what your reaction would be if Jesus appeared to you as he did to his disciples! This scene has been an inspiration for many theologians, music composers and painters who are moved by the motions of the Holy Spirit and try to represent this great encounter. The disciples were startled and terrified. And you, how are you today?

In today’s world where we have developed a critical spirit concerning things and events, we may have a lot of questions for Jesus. He knows everything; he knows about your fears and feelings, your complaints and disagreements. He asks you, “Why are you troubled? Why do questions arise in your hearts?” What is your answer?

Do you believe in him and in his resurrection? Why do you doubt what you have seen? Have you resolved your catharsis for the many injustices around the world? Do you really believe that he is real, that he is in our midst, and in the Eucharist? Or do you think that he is a ghost or perhaps a faraway God, who is not taking good care of his people? Have you found the ultimate answer insofar as the meaning of suffering and the presence of evil in our times? Are you at peace with God’s will in your life? Do you have a clear mind on what he wants you to do as you are called to be one of his disciples? Do you really believe that you are called to be a witness of his resurrection?

Look at him, he is coming constantly at the altar, he is the priest, he is the altar! He is the victim who has offered his very life for your salvation! He is in you, he is in me, he is in the poor and needy! He is hungry, he is naked, he is thirsty, he is in prison, he is in the immigrants, in the sick and dying. Let his words resound in your heart: “Have you anything here to eat? Have you anything here to eat? Have you anything here to eat? I am hungry for love, for understanding, and for your support. I thirst for your faith, I am real.” May this help us to be more aware of his presence around us and enkindle in our hearts the desire to rapidly respond to his call to serve.

You have received his peace, now you are called to be like Saint Francis of Assisi; an instrument of his peace. You, you, yes you! You are chosen to set this world on fire with His love and mercy! Let’s go and announce the good news to our brothers and sisters. He is risen!

SAINT OF THE WEEK



S. ANSELMO, ARZOBISPO DE CANTERBURY Y DOCTOR DE LA IGLESIA

El poder de un sueño

¿Cuánta fuerza tiene un sueño? Pasando las páginas de la vida de San Anselmo, se diría: mucho. Todavía Anselmo es un niño cuando una noche sueña que Dios lo invita a las altas cumbres de los Alpes para ofrecerle a comer “un pan muy blanco”. A partir de ese momento, la vida del futuro santo se dedicará a “elevant el alma a la contemplación de Dios”. Un objetivo llevado a cabo con absoluta dedicación, a pesar de la adversidad. Nacido en 1033 en Aosta en el seno de una familia noble, Anselmo sufrió fuertes contrastes con su padre, un hombre rudo y dedicado a los placeres de la vida, que le impidió entrar en la Orden Benedictina por cualquier medio, para evitar la dispersión del patrimonio familiar. Anselmo tenía sólo 15 años y, por el gran dolor del rechazo de su padre, se enfermó. Habiendo recuperado su salud, decidió irse a Francia, donde cayó en la disipación moral y se hizo sordo al llamado de Dios.

Un gran educador

Después de tres años, el encuentro providencial con Lanfranco da Pavia, prior de la abadía benedictina de Bec en Normandía, reavivó su vocación. Finalmente, a la edad de 27 años, Anselmo pudo entrar en la Orden Monástica y ser ordenado sacerdote. En 1063 él mismo se convirtió en prior del monasterio de Bec, demostrando ser un educador gentil y a la vez decidido. No le gustaban los métodos autoritarios; prefería aplicar el principio de la persuasión, que hacía crecer a los estudiantes en conciencia, enseñándoles el valor inviolable de la conciencia y de la adhesión libre y responsable a la verdad y al bien. Su genio educativo se expresa en esa “via discretionis” que une la comprensión, la misericordia y la firmeza. Los jóvenes, dice Anselmo, son pequeñas plantas que no florecen en el interior de un invernadero, sino gracias a una “sana libertad”.

En defensa de la libertad de la Iglesia

Mientras tanto, Lanfranco da Pavia se convirtió en arzobispo de Canterbury y pidió a su discípulo ayuda para reformar la comunidad eclesial local, devastada por el paso de los invasores normandos. Anselmo se trasladó entonces a Inglaterra y se dedicó con pasión a la nueva misión, tanto que - a la muerte de Lanfranco - le sucedió en la sede de Canterbury, recibiendo la ordenación episcopal en 1093. Y fue precisamente en este período que el futuro Santo se comprometió incansablemente con la libertas Ecclesiae, apoyando con inagotable energía y con gran valor la independencia del poder espiritual de parte del poder temporal, para defender a la Iglesia de la interferencia de las autoridades políticas. Pero su actitud le costó dos veces el exilio de la sede de Canterbury. Anselmo regresó allí definitivamente sólo en 1106 para dedicar los últimos años de su vida a la formación moral de los sacerdotes y a la investigación teológica. Murió el 21 de abril de 1109 y sus restos fueron enterrados en la famosa catedral de Canterbury.

“Doctor Magnífico “

Como fundador de la teología escolástica, la tradición cristiana le atribuye el título de “Doctor Magnífico” precisamente porque en Anselmo fue muy grande el deseo de profundizar en los misterios divinos a través de tres etapas: la fe, que es el don gratuito de Dios, la experiencia, es decir, la encarnación del Verbo en la vida cotidiana, y el conocimiento, es decir, la intuición contemplativa. “No intento, Señor, penetrar en tu profundidad, porque no puedo ni de lejos comparar mi intelecto con ella. Pero deseo entender, al menos hasta cierto punto, tu verdad, que mi corazón cree y ama. No trato de entender para creer, pero creo para entender”, dice Anselmo.

El amor por la verdad y la honestidad episcopal

Sus principales obras - el Monologion (Soliloquio) y el Proslogion (Coloquio), dedicados a demostrar la existencia de Dios a posteriori y a priori respectivamente - tienen como objetivo reafirmar que Dios es “el Ser del cual no se puede pensar nada más grande”. El rico epistolario de Anselmo, en cambio, revela su obra y su pensamiento político, siempre inspirado en el “amor a la verdad”, en la rectitud y honestidad episcopal, lejos de los condicionamientos temporales y del oportunismo. “Prefiero estar en desacuerdo con los hombres que de acuerdo con ellos, si ellos están en desacuerdo con Dios”, escribe el Arzobispo de Canterbury, destacando los rasgos del gobernante justo que mira al bien común, más que al interés personal. En 1163, el Papa Alejandro III concedió al difunto Anselmo “la elevación del cuerpo”, acto que en ese momento correspondía a la Canonización. Finalmente, en 1720, Clemente XI lo proclamó “Doctor de la Iglesia”.



Crece la cantidad de católicos en el mundo, ahora son 1.390 millones

El número global de bautizados aumentó en 2022, especialmente en África, mientras que, al igual que en el pasado, las vocaciones sacerdotales disminuyeron. Estos son los datos expresados por el Annuarium Statisticum Ecclesiae 2021 y el Anuario Pontificio 2024 editados por la Oficina Central de Estadísticas de la Iglesia.

El aumento de los católicos bautizados a nivel mundial, de los obispos en los continentes asiático y africano y de los diáconos permanentes en África, Asia y Oceanía, ante una disminución de las vocaciones sacerdotales, de los sacerdotes, de los religiosos profesos no sacerdotes y de las religiosas profesas. Estos son los datos estadísticos que se desprenden del Annuarium Statisticum Ecclesiae 2022 y del Anuario Pontificio 2024, actualmente en distribución en las librerías, publicado por la Imprenta Vaticana y cuya labor editorial estuvo a cargo de la Oficina Central de Estadísticas de la Iglesia.

De la lectura de los datos reportados en el Anuario Pontificio se pueden obtener informaciones relativas a la vida de la Iglesia católica en el mundo, desde el 1 de diciembre de 2022 hasta el 31 de diciembre de 2023. Durante este período, se erigieron 9 nuevos obispados y 1 administración apostólica; 2 sedes episcopales fueron elevadas a sede metropolitana y 1 Vicariato Apostólico a sede episcopal.

Los datos estadísticos del Annuarium Statisticum Ecclesiae nos permiten elaborar un panorama resumido de las principales tendencias que afectan la evolución de la Iglesia católica en el mundo.

Pope Francis: “If we don’t respect women, our society will not progress”

Let us pray that the dignity and worth of women be recognized in every culture, and for an end to the discrimination they face in various parts of the world.

In many parts of the world, women are treated like the first thing to get rid of. There are countries where women are forbidden to access aid, open a business, or go to school. In these places, they are subject to laws that make them dress a certain way. And in many countries, genital mutilation is still practiced. Let us not deprive women of their voice. Let us not rob all these abused women of their voice. They are exploited, marginalized. In theory, we all agree that men and women have the same dignity as persons. But this does not play out in practice. Governments need to commit to eliminate discriminatory laws everywhere and to work toward guaranteeing women’s human rights. Let us respect women. Let us respect their dignity, their basic rights. And if we don’t, our society will not progress. Let us pray that the dignity and worth of women be recognized in every culture, and for an end to the discrimination they face in various parts of the world.



In The Pope Video for April, Pope Francis lifts up his prayer “that the dignity and worth of women be recognized in every culture, and for an end to the discrimination they face in various parts of the world.”

“Let us respect women. Let us respect their dignity, their basic rights. And if we don’t, our society will not progress,” the Pope affirms in the message he addresses to us through the Pope’s Worldwide Prayer Network.

In his monthly intention, Pope Francis asks that governments be committed “to eliminate discriminatory laws everywhere and to work toward guaranteeing women’s human rights.”

(Vatican City, 2 April 2024) – Pope Francis once again dedicates his monthly prayer intention to women. In The Pope Video for April, which he has entrusted to the Pope’s Worldwide Prayer Network, the Holy Father insists on the steps today’s society needs to take, and asks Christians to join him in prayer “that the dignity and worth of women be recognized in every culture, and for an end to the discrimination they face in various parts of the world.”

Pope Francis’ denunciation

An Asian woman with tears in her eyes, another behind a fence with a sad look on her face, a group of victims of rape being kicked out of their village, teenagers standing in line for genital mutilation – this video accompanying Pope Francis’ prayer intention opens with strong images in sync with the Pope’s moving denunciation. His message exposes the huge gap that exists between declared principles and actual practice (“In theory, we all agree that men and women have the same dignity as persons. But this does not play out in practice”).

The Pope himself provides concrete examples, citing “discriminatory laws” currently in force: mandatory dress codes, impediments to ongoing education,

denial of assistance for job opportunities. And he recalls that “in many countries, genital mutilation is still practiced.” Thus, he states that “governments need to commit to eliminate” this discrimination and “work toward guaranteeing women’s human rights.” He asks us all to respect women, who unfortunately continue to be treated “like something to get rid of”, and who are often victims of violence and abuse in many parts of the world, even in countries claiming to be more advanced. “And if we don’t [respect women],” the Pope adds, “our society will not progress.”

Unfortunately, contradictions are not lacking in today’s world. Whereas in some countries, women have access to education and employment, and occupy leadership roles in businesses and organizations, many still do not enjoy the same opportunities as men. Just think of the job market: less than one in two women in the world work and women earn 23% less than men. The same goes for education, when we consider that women who are literate are in the minority in some countries. For example, the rate is 23%; in Niger, 27%. Fewer opportunities translate into enormous economic difficulties. According to UN Women, it is estimated that by 2030 8% of women and girls will live in extreme poverty, and 25% of women will not have enough to eat.

Man and women, equal in dignity

Respect for the dignity of every person is a central tenet of Christianity since the life of each person is sacred, having been created in God’s image (see Genesis 1:26-27).

The topic of the role of women resounded in the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops’ Synthesis Report that took place in October of last year. “We are created, male and female, in the image and likeness of God. From the beginning, creation manifests unity and difference, bestowing on women and men a shared nature, calling, and destiny, and two distinct experiences of being human.... We have had a very positive experience of the reciprocity between women and men during this Assembly. Together we echo the call made in the previous phases of the synodal process, that the Church adopt a more decisive commitment to understand and accompany women from a pastoral and sacramental point of view,” the synod participants state in the document.

Heroines of all times

Father Frédéric Fornos S.J., International Director of the Pope’s Worldwide Prayer Network, recalls that “from the beginning, Jesus welcomed women as his disciples. This was a novelty in the society of that time. As the Gospels testify, Jesus’ mother Mary held a prominent place among the Apostles and in the early community. Jesus entrusted the mission of announcing his resurrection to his brothers to a woman, Mary Magdalene. Throughout history, women have contributed to the spiritual dynamism in the Church: Teresa of Avila, Catherine of Siena, and Thérèse of Lisieux, who are Doctors of the Church, and countless other saints. As the Pope calls us to pray this month ‘that the dignity and worth of women be recognized in every culture, and for an end to the discrimination they face in various parts of the world,’ let us also continue to recognize women’s role in the Church. Primary observation: If the Christian community were a business, without the active participation of women, it would go bankrupt.”

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
