

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, in today's Gospel Jesus is commissioning his disciples to go out, to the whole world, to the peripheries, to every creature! As he sent out his disciples, we all are being entrusted with a mission. There is so many bad news everywhere, but there is a great new that all creatures shall hear: Jesus is risen, alleluia and now he is sited at the right hand of the Father to interceder for us and where the head is the body shall be. The Lord has been taken into heaven but one day he will come back and take us to himself.

As we begin the month of May when we celebrate confirmations, first communions and graduations, it is necessary to remember that this month we also honor our Blessed Mother and is often referred to as the month of Mary. During this troubled time, we may remember the powerful prayer of the Memorare: Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Our Blessed Mother is always ready to help us!

This Saturday at 9:00 am, 28 of our children will have received the Sacrament of Confirmation by the imposition of Bishop Peter Baldacchino's hands. We all know of the special love that Bishop Peter has for our parish; please thank him whenever you see him around. I firmly believe that we are very blessed to have him as our shepherd.

This year on May 18th and 19th, 28 of our children are going to make their First Communion. They are going to be assigned to the different Masses of our parish. You all have the opportunity to become witnesses of the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and the great love God feels for them,

On May 19th we are going to celebrate Pentecost Sunday. Jesus always fulfills his promises he is not leaving us orphans, the paraclete, the consoler, the giver of life is coming to us. I pray that we may wait for Him with open hearts. Also, it will give us the opportunity to remind our confirmation children that confirmation is not a graduation but the beginning of a very important Mission: to go to the world and proclaim the good news of the Gospel to our brothers and sisters.

This year we want to celebrate the Immaculate Heart of Mary feast after the morning Mass. We are gathering at Finley Hall for some food and fellowship. Our Blessed mother has always been an integral part of the life at IHM. Please join us on May 13th to pray the Living Rosary for world peace and the intentions of our Holy Father.

This year we are going to reflect more on the Eucharistic Revival. I strongly believe that it is our responsibility as Priests to help you understand the Holy Sacrifice of Jesus; so, wait for some good news on this topic. I highly encourage you to show more respect to the Holy places and keep silent while others are praying, this reflects our faith and our care for the house of the Lord.

I am happy to see a lot of young people around and during the different Masses. I know that for some it is not easy to concentrate when children are crying but it is the Lord himself who asks us to let his children come to Him. I heard this true saying: If during Mass you don't hear your children crying, it means that your church is dying.

Summer has begun and I invite you and remind you to dress modestly. This also shows respect to God's temples: The church and our bodies. This reminder is for all men and women alike.

This year on May 20th we are going to celebrate the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mother of the Church. Pope Francis has decreed that this memorial should be celebrated every year as an obligatory memorial. "I invite everyone," he insisted, "to invoke Mary's intercession, so that the Lord may grant peace to the whole world, especially to the dear and martyred Ukraine, and to Palestine, Israel, and Myanmar." "I urge everyone to value praying the Holy Rosary this May." (Wednesday, 8 May, marks the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary)

Why all these reminders, because we shall all be on the same page, in tune not just with our pastors or priests but with the Lord.

I pray that we may be obedient to his commands and as good disciples go forth and preach everywhere, remembering that as the Lord worked with his disciples and confirmed the word through accompanying signs, he also will work with us.

Finally, as we lift our prayers for world peace, let us recall with gratitude and affection all mothers, those who are still with us and those who have gone to Heaven. But especially those who are fathers and mothers and suffering the consequences of family separation or abandonment.








# Pentecost

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children—Francisco and Jacinta Marto and their cousin Lucia dos Santos—received apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria near Fatima, a city 110 miles north of Lisbon. Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia.

Mary gave the children three secrets. Following the deaths of Francisco and Jacinta in 1919 and 1920 respectively, Lucia revealed the first secret in 1927. It concerned devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The second secret was a vision of hell. When Lucia grew up she became a Carmelite nun and died in 2005 at the age of 97.

Pope John Paul II directed the Holy See's Secretary of State to reveal the third secret in 2000; it spoke of a "bishop in white" who was shot by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows into him. Many people linked this vision to the assassination attempt against Pope John Paul II in St. Peter's Square on May 13, 1981.

The feast of Our Lady of Fatima was approved by the local bishop in 1930; it was added to the Church's worldwide calendar in 2002.

## Pope at Audience: The world needs Christian hope

Pope Francis reflects on the theological virtue of hope as he continues his cycle of catecheses on the vices and the virtues.



Hope “is the answer offered to the heart” when it ponders the question of our final destiny, Pope Francis said at the General Audience on Wednesday.

Focusing on the second of the three theological virtues, the Holy Father acknowledged that “a negative answer” to questions about the meaning of life will lead to sadness: “If there is no meaning to the journey of life, if at the beginning and the end, there is nothing, then we ask ourselves why we should walk” and we end in desperation.

Without hope many people give up on life and “all the other virtues risk crumbling and ending up in ashes,” the Pope said, before quoting Benedict XVI: “Only when the future is certain as a positive reality does it become possible to live in the present as well.”

### A theological virtue

Christians realize that hope does not come from their own merit, Pope Francis said. “If they believe in the future, it is because Christ died and rose again and gave us His Spirit.” He explained that hope is a “theological” virtue precisely because “it does not emanate from us... but is a gift that comes directly from God.”

Quoting a famous passage from St Paul – “If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins” – the Pope contrasted faith and disbelief: “if you believe in the Resurrection of Christ, then you know with certainty that no defeat and no death is forever. But if you do not believe in the Resurrection of Christ, then everything becomes hollow, even the preaching of the Apostles.”

Pope Francis went on to warn against sins against hope, including “bad nostalgia” for the happiness of the past and despair for our sins, when we forget that “God is merciful and greater than our hearts.”

### A world in need of hope

“The world today is in great need of this Christian virtue,” the Pope proclaimed, adding that it also needs patience, “a virtue that walks in close contact with hope.” Those who are patient, he said, “are weavers of goodness,” always stubbornly desiring peace.

“Even when around us many have succumbed to disillusionment,” Pope Francis said, “those who are inspired by hope and are patient are able to get through the darkest of nights.”

Finally, the Holy Father said that “hope is the virtue of the young at heart,” recalling the New Testament example of Simeon and Anna, who encountered the newborn Messiah in the Temple. Pope Francis concluded that it would be a great grace if, at the end of our lives, we could proclaim with Simeon, “Lord, now let your servant depart in peace... for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of every people.”

Pope Francis concluded by calling on the faithful to “go forward and ask for the grace to have hope, hope with patience.” And he invited them to “Always look to the final encounter; always see that the Lord is always near us, that death will never, never be victorious.”

## El Papa pidió nuevamente que Dios conceda la paz al mundo

Francisco, al final de la audiencia general, recordó la Súplica a Nuestra Señora de Pompeya que hoy eleva la Iglesia e invitó a invocar la intercesión de María. En su saludo a los polacos, recordando a San Estanislao dijo: “Juan Pablo II escribió que apoyó la supervivencia de Polonia durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial. Que obtenga también hoy el don de la paz en Europa”. Y pronunció una oración por Argentina, que hoy celebra Nuestra Señora de Luján

“Paz al mundo entero – especialmente – a la querida y martirizada Ucrania, a Palestina, a Israel y a Myanmar”. Al final de la audiencia general, el Santo Padre hizo un nuevo llamamiento por los territorios desgarrados por la muerte, la violencia y la persecución.

Para Ucrania, donde no cesan las incursiones rusas (la última afectó a centrales de generación y distribución de electricidad en seis regiones); para Oriente Medio, donde aumentan las muertes entre la ciudad de Gaza y Rafah; para



Myanmar, sumida en una prolongada crisis política, con enfrentamientos y violencia entre las tropas del gobierno militar y grupos étnicos armados, con millones de desplazados y enormes daños causados por catástrofes naturales, a lo que se añade la dramática situación de los Rohingya.

### La intercesión de María

Mirando a estas tierras heridas, el Papa Francisco se unió a la oración que la Iglesia eleva cada 8 de mayo a Nuestra Señora de Pompeya, la llamada “Súplica” a la Virgen del Rosario. De ahí su invitación a todos “a invocar la intercesión de María, para que el Señor conceda la paz al mundo entero”.

### Paz para Europa


Además, antes de finalizar esta audiencia, el Pontífice pidió otra intercesión, la de San Estanislao, obispo y mártir, patrono de Polonia, cuya solemnidad se celebra hoy. En su saludo a los fieles polacos, presentes en la Plaza de San Pedro, Francisco recordó que “San Juan Pablo II escribió de él que desde lo alto del cielo participó en los sufrimientos y esperanzas de su nación, sosteniendo su supervivencia especialmente durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial”.

*“Que la intercesión de San Estanislao obtenga también hoy el don de la paz en Europa y en todo el mundo, especialmente en Ucrania y Oriente Medio”*

### Sembradores de esperanza y tejedores de bien

El Papa pidió asimismo un compromiso concreto de todos los creyentes para construir un futuro de paz: “Que el Señor aumente nuestra esperanza y nuestra paciencia, para que seamos artífices de paz y de bondad en un mundo que tiene gran necesidad de esta virtud”, dijo Francisco en su saludo a los peregrinos españoles. Palabras que resonaron aún más claramente al dar su bienvenida a los franceses.

*“Ante un futuro que a veces puede parecer oscuro, seamos sembradores de esperanza y tejedores de bien, convencidos de que la vida se puede vivir de otra manera y de que la paz es posible”*


