From the *Pastor*

"And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

Mt 28:16-20

Dear family of faith: Today we find comfort in Jesus' words, He is with us and will always be with us! As humans we cannot deny the presence of suffering and the problem of evil in our times. This society is making us immune to suffering and indifferent to the evils around us. This topic needs special attention because it is misunderstood, and some get the idea that we worship a masochist God. Most of the time when we face suffering, we blame God and there inevitably arises the question: Why? It is a question about the cause, the reason, and equally, about the purpose of suffering.

We know a God that has been revealed by Jesus: A God of love, the Lord of Mercy, whose desire and will is that we be partakers of the Beata Bita: The 'happy life' which, according to the great Saint Agustine of Hippo, does not consist either in the satisfaction of the body nor in the possession of material things, but in doing the will of God. Augustine conceived of happiness as consisting of the union of the soul with God after the body has died.

St. Augustine (born November 13, 354, Tagaste, Numidia [now Souk Ahras, Algeria]—died August 28, 430, Hippo Regius [now Annaba, Algeria]; feast day August 28) was the bishop of Hippo from 396 to 430, one of the Latin Fathers of the Church and perhaps the most significant Christian thinker after St. Paul. Augustine's adaptation of classical thought to Christian teaching created a theological system of great power and lasting influence. He was the author of numerous written works, the most important of which are *Confessions* (c. 400) and *The City of God* (c. 413–426).

I share with you that after St. Thomas Aquinas, St Augustine is my favorite philosopher and theologian. His rhetoric is excellent, but his testimony is very touching. He was a prideful man searching for Truth—like us. Thanks to God and the prayers of his mother, he went into conversion and left us one of the most powerful teachings on the meaning of life and the power of God. Like St. Monica, we are called to bring others to the knowledge of God, through our prayers and action we can evangelize and fulfill Jesus' command of going and making disciples of all nations.

I encourage you not to lose hope. God cares for you in ways that you can't imagine. He knows everything. Like a shipwrecked victim we move on an immensurable ocean of God's love; and if we allow Him to find us, he will reveal to us the amazing plans he has for us.

I have always thought that our faith is very Christo-central—which is great. But as we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday, I want you to offer yourself the opportunity to know better God our Father and the Holy Spirit. Sometimes we feel fatherless or abandoned thinking that he does not care about what is happening in our lives or the injustices we are facing. I tell you he knows everything, and he comes constantly to us. Don't ignore Him; listen to the Holy spirit; talk to him. Be humble! It's okay to feel in need; to ask for help and guidance.

Saint Augustine put up much resistance for years, but he allowed the Lord to find him in unimaginable ways and now he is a great saint and Father of the Church. Regarding the Holy Trinity and Saint Agustine, there is a story which I really love to share. The story goes as follows: While Augustine was working on his book *On the Trinity*, he was walking by the seaside one day, meditating on the difficult problem of how God could be three Persons at once. He came upon a little child. The child had dug a little hole in the sand, and with a small spoon or seashell was scooping water from the sea into the small hole. Augustine watched him for a while and finally asked the child what he was doing. The child answered that he would scoop all the water from the sea and pour it into the little hole in the sand. 'What?' Augustine said. 'That is impossible. Obviously, the sea is too

large and the hole too small.' 'Indeed,' said the child, 'but I will sooner draw all the water from the sea and empty it into this hole than you will succeed in penetrating the mystery of the Holy Trinity with your limited understanding.' Augustine turned away in amazement and when he looked back the child had disappeared. In his quest for the meaning of life he said: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."

Maybe an angel will never appear to you, but today the Lord is speaking clearly and distinctly to your soul. Your sufferings in this life are nothing compared with the glory of God to be revealed in you. Your grief will become joy! Just be humble, be patient, be sincere, be attentive, be human, and have faith.

Del *Párroco*

"Y he aquí, yo estoy con vosotros todos los días, hasta el fin del mundo." Mateo 28:16-20

Querida familia de fe: ¡Hoy encontramos consuelo en las palabras de Jesús, El está con nosotros y estará siempre con nosotros! Como seres humanos no podemos negar la presencia del sufrimiento y el problema del mal en nuestro tiempo. Esta sociedad nos hace inmunes al sufrimiento e indiferentes a los males que nos rodean. Este tema necesita una atención especial porque es mal entendido, y algunos tienen la idea de que adoramos a un Dios masoquista. La mayoría de las veces, cuando nos enfrentamos al sufrimiento, culpamos a Dios e inevitablemente surge la pregunta: ¿Por qué? Es una pregunta sobre la causa, la razón e, igualmente, sobre el propósito del sufrimiento.

Conocemos a un Dios que ha sido revelado por Jesús: Un Dios de amor, el Señor de la Misericordia, cuyo deseo y voluntad es que seamos partícipes de la Beata Bita: La "vida feliz" que, según el gran San Agustín de Hipona, no consiste ni en la satisfacción del cuerpo ni en la posesión de las cosas materiales, sino en hacer la voluntad de Dios. Agustín concebía la felicidad como la unión del alma con Dios después de la muerte del cuerpo.

San Agustín (nacido el 13 de noviembre de 354 en Tagaste, Numidia - fallecido el 28 de agosto de 430 en Hipona Regio [ahora Annaba, Argelia]; fiesta el 28 de agosto) fue el obispo de Hipona de 396 a 430, uno de los Padres latinos de la Iglesia y quizás el pensador cristiano más importante después de San Pablo. La adaptación de Agustín del pensamiento clásico a la enseñanza cristiana creó un sistema teológico de gran poder e influencia duradera. Fue autor de numerosas obras escritas, las más importantes de las cuales son *Confesiones* (c. 400) y *La ciudad de Dios* (c. 413-426).

Comparto con ustedes que después de Santo Tomás de Aquino, San Agustín es mi filósofo y teólogo favorito. Su retórica es excelente, pero su testimonio es muy convocador. Era un hombre orgulloso que buscaba la Verdad, como nosotros. Gracias a Dios y a las oraciones de su madre, se convirtió y nos dejó una de las enseñanzas más poderosas sobre el significado de la vida y el poder de Dios. Al igual que Santa Mónica, estamos llamados a llevar a otros al conocimiento de Dios, a través de nuestras oraciones y acciones podemos evangelizar y cumplir el mandato de Jesús de ir y hacer discípulos de todas las naciones.

Os animo a no perder la esperanza. Dios cuida de ti de maneras que no puedes imaginar. Él lo sabe todo. Como una víctima naufragada nos movemos en un océano incommensurable del amor de Dios; y si permitimos que nos encuentre, nos revelará los asombrosos planes que tiene para nosotros.

Siempre he pensado que nuestra fe es muy Cristocéntrico, lo cual es genial. Pero mientras celebramos el Domingo de la Santísima Trinidad, quiero que te ofrezcas la oportunidad de conocer mejor a Dios nuestro Padre y al Espíritu Santo. A veces nos sentimos huérfanos de padre o abandonados pensando que él no le importa lo que está sucediendo en nuestras vidas o las injusticias a las que nos enfrentamos. Les digo que él lo sabe todo, y viene constantemente a nosotros. No lo ignores; escucha al Espíritu Santo; Habla con él. ¡Sé humilde! Está bien sentirse necesitado; para pedir ayuda y orientación.

San Agustín opuso mucha resistencia durante años, pero permitió que el Señor lo encontrara de maneras inimaginables y ahora es un gran santo y Padre de la Iglesia. Con respecto a la Santísima Trinidad y San Agustín, hay una historia que me encanta compartir. La historia es la siguiente: Mientras Agustín estaba trabajando en su libro *Sobre la Trinidad*, un día estaba caminando por la orilla del mar, meditando sobre el difícil problema de cómo Dios podía ser tres Personas a la vez. Se encontró con un niño pequeño. El niño había cavado un pequeño agujero en la arena, y con una pequeña cuchara o concha marina estaba recogiendo agua del mar en el pequeño agujero. Agustín lo observó durante un rato y finalmente le preguntó al niño qué estaba haciendo. El niño respondió que recogería toda el agua del mar y la vertería en el pequeño agujero en la arena. —¿Qué?—dijo Agustín—. —Eso es imposible. Obviamente, el mar es demasiado grande y el agujero demasiado pequeño". "Efectivamente", dijo el niño, "pero antes sacaré toda el agua del mar y la vaciaré en este agujero antes que tú lograrás penetrar en el misterio de la

Santísima Trinidad con tu limitado entendimiento". Agustín se dio la vuelta con asombro y, cuando miró hacia atrás, el niño había desaparecido. En su búsqueda del sentido de la vida dijo: "Nos has hecho para ti, oh Señor, y nuestros corazones están inquietos hasta que descansan en ti".

Tal vez nunca se te aparezca un ángel, pero hoy el Señor le está hablando clara y distintamente a tu alma. Tus sufrimientos en esta vida no son nada comparados con la gloria de Dios que se revelará en ti. ¡Tu dolor se convertirá en alegría! Solo sé humilde, sé paciente, sé sincero, sé atento, sé humano y ten fe.

Sor Viktoriya y su misión: devolver la sonrisa a los niños ucranianos

Sor Viktoriya Andrushchyshyna salva la infancia destruida por la guerra. Dispensa gotas de bien en las zonas fronterizas, y sus ángeles de alegría llegan a ciudades y pueblos liberados de la ocupación rusa. Citando al Papa Francisco sobre el hecho de que los niños ucranianos ya no sonríen, se ve como la "monja que devuelve la sonrisa". "Temo solo una cosa, tener que enterrar a alguno de los niños que cuidamos", afirmó la Hna. Viktoriya. Desde los primeros momentos después de la agresión rusa en Ucrania, comenzó a crear refugios seguros para madres con niños pequeños y mujeres embarazadas.

El refugio en la estación y los ángeles de la alegría

"Durante la primera semana de bombardeos, estábamos en el sótano, asustadas, y pensando en cómo ayudar a nuestros hijos", contó. Más tarde, se dirigió a la estación de tren, donde se detenían los refugiados del este de Ucrania. Una mujer que conoció por casualidad le dijo que había preparado una habitación para madres con hijos, donde podían sentirse seguras.

Empezó a cuidar de los hijos de los desplazados que se habían refugiado en Vinnytsia. Reunió a un grupo de voluntarios y comenzó a organizar los juegos: "Quería sacar a los niños de la tristeza en la que estaban atrapados". Señaló que la guerra impone a los niños un régimen difícil de soportar: no pueden ir a la escuela ni salir a jugar. Para formalizar el proyecto que comenzaba a tomar formas concretas, la monja se unió al Servicio de Emergencia Cristiano, establecido en Kiev para ayudar a las personas después del estallido de la guerra en 2014. En ella ha creado un cuerpo de ayuda a los niños: "Los Ángeles de la Alegría".



La vocación angélica

El nombre no es aleatorio. Sor Viktoriya pertenece a la Congregación de las Hermanas de los Ángeles, fundada en 1889 cuando la Iglesia fue duramente perseguida por el zar ruso. Las conoció gracias a su tía materna. "Cuando mi tía venía a vernos, daba un excelente testimonio y yo decidí seguir sus pasos". En 2005, hizo sus primeros votos. Estudió pedagogía, lo que le dio un nuevo rumbo a su vida. "Trabajar con niños es mi pasión, es una tarea de mucha responsabilidad, además los padres nos confían sus alegrías, confiando en que están seguros y que serán educados en los más altos valores" – dijo. Confiesa que ya había tenido una buena escuela en casa, donde había cuidado a cuatro hermanos menores. Una hermana, siguiendo sus huellas, ha entrado en las Hermanas de los Ángeles.

La monja que devuelve la sonrisa


Actualmente, sor Viktoriya trabaja en Zhytomyr, pero con sus ángeles de la alegría viajan continuamente a las zonas liberadas de los rusos. La ayuda se dirige principalmente a los niños desplazados, procedentes de familias difíciles y cuyos padres murieron en la guerra. Cada vez, de 50 a 70 niños participan en el proyecto "Aventuras Angélicas". "Llegamos temprano, decoramos la habitación con globos, llevamos la máquina de algodón de azúcar y los perritos calientes, y comienzan los juegos", dice. Cada uno de los niños recibe una aureola, y la monja junto con los voluntarios les cuenta a los pequeños sobre los ángeles y su misión, y que cada uno de nosotros puede ser un ángel para el prójimo. Durante el juego, también aparece un pastel para los niños que celebran su cumpleaños: "Les devolvemos un sustituto de la normalidad, pensamos en las pequeñas cosas que los padres ya no tienen fuerzas para cuidar". Confiesa que su corazón se rompe cuando los niños reciben regalos sin la menor emoción en la cara, sin una sonrisa. "Se necesita mucho tiempo y paciencia para que la tristeza disminuya", dijo. Recuerda las lágrimas de las madres que ven a sus hijos sonreír de nuevo. Esta es la mayor recompensa para los ángeles de la alegría. Entre los voluntarios se encuentran, entre otros, madres y padres que llevan a sus hijos a aventuras angélicas. "Es un testimonio increíblemente edificante ver a sus padres servir a los necesitados", dijo la Hermana Viktoriya.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



ST. AUGUSTINE, ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY

In the year 596, some 40 monks set out from Rome to evangelize the Anglo-Saxons in England. Leading the group was Augustine, the prior of their monastery. Hardly had he and his men reached Gaul when they heard stories of the ferocity of the Anglo-Saxons and of the treacherous waters of the English Channel. Augustine returned to Rome and to Gregory the Great—the pope who had sent them—only to be assured by him that their fears were groundless.



Augustine set out again. This time the group crossed the English Channel and landed in the territory of Kent, ruled by King Ethelbert, a pagan married to a Christian, Bertha. Ethelbert received them kindly, set up a residence for them in Canterbury and within the year, on Pentecost Sunday 597, was himself baptized. After being consecrated a bishop in France, Augustine returned to Canterbury, where he founded his see. He constructed a church and monastery near where the present cathedral, begun in 1070, now stands. As the faith spread, additional sees were established at London and Rochester.

Work was sometimes slow and Augustine did not always meet with success. Attempts to reconcile the Anglo-Saxon Christians with the original Briton Christians—who had been driven into western England by Anglo-Saxon invaders—ended in dismal failure. Augustine failed to convince the Britons to give up certain Celtic customs at variance with Rome and to forget their bitterness, helping him evangelize their Anglo-Saxon conquerors.

Laboring patiently, Augustine wisely heeded the missionary principles—quite enlightened for the times—suggested by Pope Gregory: purify rather than destroy pagan temples and customs; let pagan rites and festivals be transformed into Christian feasts; retain local customs as far as possible. The limited success Augustine achieved in England before his death in 605, a short eight years after his arrival, would eventually bear fruit long after in the conversion of England. Augustine of Canterbury can truly be called the "Apostle of England."



Seeds of Hope



Laudato Si' Week is an eight-day campaign held annually in May to mark the anniversary of Pope Francis' landmark encyclical on creation care. Find prayer and action resources to engage your community.

Reflect on Pope Francis' Laudate Deum (Praise God)

Use this new prayer inspired by Laudate Deum, read the exhortation, and study with materials in English and Spanish from the Dicastery for Integral Human Development.

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has long encouraged Catholics in the United States to protect creation. USCCB resources deepen the Catholic family's understanding of integral ecology, the understanding that "everything is connected."

Jill Rauh, USCCB's Director of Education and Outreach, says that this is a special moment for deepening the ties that unite us.

"A lot of people are yearning for community and connection," Rauh said. The USCCB resources on Laudato Si' fulfill this yearning, and they can be used during and after Laudato Si' Week, 16-24 May. Resources include study guides for Laudato Si', and for Querida Amazonia, Pope Francis' post-synodal apostolic exhortation. In addition, USCCB has published a one-pager on Laudato Si', liturgy and preaching resources, and a video about the children's book Drop by Drop, which highlights the lack of water across around the world.


Rauh says that the bishops' conference hopes that people across the U.S. will "use whatever resources are most helpful to them."

"We want people through prayer and reflection to really connect with the call . . . that we have to care for ourselves, for one another, for all of creation." Rauh says that the conference hopes that Catholics will "really take that to heart."

Many faith-sharing groups have adapted their practices to meet online through Zoom or other video-conferencing programs. Rauh suggested that such groups could find the guides helpful for future meetings.

"A family could also use a guide, or somebody who is a single individual and wants to take a little bit of time with these," she said.
