To whom we shall go?

Brothers and Sisters: This Sunday, the Gospel message is very powerful. After reflecting on Jesus' miracles—especially the multiplication of the loaves of bread and fish—and listening to the discourses on the Bread of Life, we are called to accept and believe in Jesus' words. Moreover, it is necessary that we acknowledge that the words he has spoken to us are Spirit and life.

Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?"

How many times as his disciples have, we also had a hard time understanding Jesus' messages and instead being more attentive while listening we start murmuring? This is not only a serious problem of our times but also a grievous sin that is leading many to perdition and turning them into agents of division. St. Augustine goes even further: "Oh, what a miserable, deadly plague! Oh, how poisonous!"

Pride, impatience, ingratitude, murmuring—and any number of other sins—can drag us down and lead to sinning through complaining and grumbling. When we learn to discern what's going on in our hearts, we can begin to make the changes that will get us on the right track. We can begin to break the chains that bind us to sinful habits and replace those bad habits with positive, virtuous habits instead.

Nowadays, there are many who attack Catholic beliefs, and sometimes this comes from within our own people. It is necessary to learn that there is a rooted biblical explanation for Catholic perspectives on topics like salvation, church authority, and the Eucharist.

Again, the words of Jesus are Spirit and life, but as he says, there are some of us who do not believe. As the people of Jesus' times are you also going to leave him? Today it is Jesus himself asking you, "Do you also want to leave?" How challenging it is to fight the temptation to run away, or to blame others, simply because we are not being pleased or because we cannot get rid of our bigotry and futility!

If we are truly following Jesus, it is necessary to be with him until the end. Let us follow the example of Peter who confesses that may there are many ways, but only Jesus has the words of eternal life. I pray that we may be convinced, as Peter was, that Jesus is the Holy one of God, then you will have the strength to continue with the mission that the Lord has entrusted to all of us.

Hermanos y hermanas, el mensaje del Evangelio de este domingo es muy poderoso. Y reflexionando en los milagros de Jesús, especialmente en el de la multiplicación de los panes y los pescados; y escuchando sus discursos sobre el pan de vida, estamos llamados a aceptar y creer las palabras de Jesús. Aún más, es necesario que reconozcamos que las palabras que Él nos ha dirigido son Espíritu y vida.

Muchos de los discípulos de Jesús que lo escucharon, dijeron: "Esto que dice es duro, ¿quién lo puede aceptar?"

Orgullo, impaciencia, ingratitud, murmuración; y muchos otros pecados, pueden arrastrarnos y llevarnos a pecar todavía más, a través de los reclamos y de las quejas. Cuando aprendemos a discernir lo que hay en nuestro corazón, comenzamos a hacer cambios que nos colocan en la dirección correcta. Entonces podemos comenzar a romper las cadenas que nos atan a los hábitos pecaminosos, y reemplazarlos con hábitos positivos y virtuosos.

En la actualidad hay muchos ataques contra las creencias católicas, y algunas veces provienen de nuestra propia gente. Es necesario aprender que hay una explicación con raíces bíblicas para la perspectiva católica en los temas de salvación, autoridad de la Iglesia y Eucaristía.



Pope renews prayers for peace in countries torn by conflict

Pope Francis makes his latest appeal for peace amid the ongoing conflicts and situations of political instability in the Democratic Republic of Congo, South Sudan, Ukraine, Myanmar, and the Holy Land.

The Holy Father made his latest appeals for peace in places torn by war and conflict, and for closeness to suffering populations, at the conclusion of his Wednesday General Audience.

Addressing the pilgrims present, the Pope recalled the great suffering of war-torn Ukraine, urging all faithful to not forget the beleaguered nation.

"Let us not forget the martyred Ukraine," he urged, stressing: "Let us not forget Myanmar, South Sudan, North Kivu, and so many countries that are at war."

The Pope likewise prayed for those suffering from the war in the Holy Land.

"Let us pray for peace," he added.

The Holy Father also prayed for the gift of peace in his greetings to Polish pilgrims.

He lamented that "our world, marked by wars and divisions, needs more than ever the fruits of the Holy Spirit," as he urged Christians to live peace in the simple actions of daily life.

"Beginning with your families and workplaces," he urged, "bring love, peace and goodness into your daily lives."

Recalling that many Poles are currently making pilgrimages to Our Lady of Jasna Góra, the Holy Father prayed that her intercession might "grant the world the gift of much-desired peace."

Prayers for Catechists who carry faith forward

Pope Francis recalled that Wednesday, August 21st marks the memorial of St. Pius X, known as the Pope of catechism.


"We think of our catechists who do so much work, and, in some parts of the world, are the first to carry the faith forward," the Holy Father commended, as he invited the faithful to "pray today for catechists;" that "the Lord will make them courageous," and "that they can go forward."

Catechetical Sunday 2024

September 15, 2024

Catechetical Sunday will be celebrated on September 15, 2024, with the theme, "Lord, when did we see you hungry?" (Matthew 25:37). The day is set aside to recognize and honor the role of catechists in parish communities and to invite the church to consider their responsibility to share their faith with others.

The day is also an opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays in passing on the faith and witnessing to the Gospel. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that parents are the first and most important catechists of their children, but that everyone who forms the faith of children at home is a catechist.

During the day, those who have been designated as catechists will be commissioned for their ministry.

Santa Emily de Vialar

Al servicio de los más pobres entre los pobres

Día festivo: 24 de agosto

Santa Emily consagró su vida a los pobres, a quienes acogió en su casa, involucrando a algunos de sus compañeros en una verdadera organización benéfica. Junto a ellos, en 1832, en Gaillac, inauguró una nueva forma de vida religiosa, San José de la Aparición, dedicada al servicio de todos los más pobres entre los pobres - cuidándolos en todas sus miserias - así como como atender la educación de niñas muy jóvenes.

Emily de Vialar murió el 24 de agosto de 1856, día en que se la celebra en Marsella, donde trabajó durante mucho tiempo. Fundó su congregación en Christmastide de 1832.

Con el pensamiento de difundir el Evangelio en los países más lejanos, fundó la Congregación de las Hermanas de San José de la Asunción y a pesar de muchas dificultades, persecuciones y pobreza, logró fundar 42 casas desde el norte de África hasta Birmania, dando así un importante desarrollo al Instituto.

Emily fue canonizada el 17 de junio de 1951 por el Papa Pío XII. Hoy sus hermanas están presentes en los cinco continentes.

Saint Emily de Vialar

In the service of the poorest of the poor

Feast Day: August 24th



Santa Emily consecrated her life to the poor, whom she welcomed in her home, involving some of her companions in a true charity organization. Together with them, in 1832, in Gaillac, she inaugurated a new form of religious life, St. Joseph of the Apparition, devoted to the service of all the poorest of the poor - caring for them in their every sort of misery - as well as attending to the education of very young girls.

Emily de Vialar died on August 24, 1856, the day on which she is celebrated in Marseille, where she worked for a long time. She founded her congregation at Christmastide, 1832.

With the thought of spreading the Gospel in the farthest countries, she founded the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Assumption and despite many difficulties, persecutions and poverty, managed to found 42 houses from North Africa to Burma, thus giving a significant development to the Institute.

Emily was canonized on June 17, 1951, by Pope Pius XII. Today her sisters are present on all five continents.

El Papa: La pena de muerte no hace justicia, es un veneno para la sociedad

«Un cristiano en el corredor de la muerte. Mi compromiso junto a los condenados» es el título del libro de Dale Racinella, publicado por Libreria Editrice Vaticana, que sale a la venta el martes 27 de agosto, con prólogo del Papa Francisco. Racinella, de 72 años, antiguo abogado de éxito en Wall Street, acompaña espiritualmente a los condenados en algunas penitenciarías de Florida desde 1998 como capellán laico junto a su esposa Susan. VATICAN CITY (CNS)

Capital punishment promotes a deadly attitude of revenge and denies the possibility of change in the lives of incarcerated people, Pope Francis said.

“The death penalty is in no way the solution to the violence that can strike innocent people,” the pope wrote in the preface to a new book on prison chaplaincy.



Capital executions, “far from bringing justice, fuel a sense of revenge that becomes a dangerous poison for the body of our civil societies,” the pope wrote. And rather than continue the cycle of violence, governments “should focus on allowing prisoners the opportunity to truly change their lives, rather than investing money and resources in their execution, as if they were human beings no longer worthy of living and to be disposed of.”

The book featuring the pope’s preface, titled “A Christian on Death Row,” shares the experiences of Dale Racinella, a lay Catholic prison chaplain and licensed attorney who, along with his wife, has accompanied people on death row and in solitary confinement in Florida prisons since 1998. The book, published by the Vatican publishing house, was set to go on sale Aug. 27.

Pope Francis called Racinella’s work a “living and passionate witness to God’s school of infinite mercy,” and he said it is a “great gift to the church and to society in the United States.”

In light of the upcoming Holy Year 2025, the pope wrote, Catholics should “collectively call for the abolition of the death penalty.”

“As the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy taught us, we must never think that there could be a sin, a mistake, or an action of ours that distances us permanently from the Lord. His heart has already been crucified for us,” he wrote. “And God can only forgive us.”

In 2018, the pope formally changed the Catechism of the Catholic Church to unambiguously oppose the death penalty. While the previous language allowed for the death penalty in extreme cases, the revised entry in the catechism calls the death penalty “inadmissible” and states that the church “works for determination for its abolition worldwide.”

In his preface, Pope Francis said that God’s infinite mercy toward each person “can also be scandalous,” noting the many criticisms and rejections Racinella has faced for his prison ministry. “But is it not true that Jesus welcomed in His embrace a thief condemned to death?” the pope asked.

“Even the most heinous of our sins does not mar our identity in God’s eyes: we remain His children, loved by Him, protected by Him and considered precious.”

Pope Francis explained that in one loving gaze, “like that of Christ on the cross,” incarcerated people “may find a new meaning in their lives and indeed, in their deaths.”

X Encuentro de Obispos en Panamá: Un llamado urgente ante la crisis migratoria

Panamá es el escenario del X Encuentro de Obispos y Agentes de Pastoral Migratoria de Centroamérica, Norteamérica y el Caribe, que se celebra del 19 al 23 de agosto. El encuentro liderado por el Cardenal Michael Czerny, Prefecto del Dicasterio para el Servicio del Desarrollo Humano Integral de la Santa Sede, busca fortalecer el compromiso de la Iglesia en la protección y acompañamiento de quienes huyen de la violencia y la pobreza en sus países de origen.

Lucía Elvira – Ciudad del Vaticano

Este lunes 19 de agosto de 2024, líderes de la Iglesia Católica, encabezados por el Cardenal Michael Czerny, Prefecto del Dicasterio para el Servicio del Desarrollo Humano Integral de la Santa Sede, iniciaron el X Encuentro de Obispos y Agentes de Pastoral Migratoria con una visita al



Centro de Recepción Migratoria en Lajas Blancas, Darién. La región del Darién es conocida por ser una de las rutas más peligrosas para los migrantes que intentan llegar a Norteamérica, y esta visita permitió a los obispos y sacerdotes ver de primera mano las duras condiciones que enfrentan quienes atraviesan este tramo. El evento se extenderá hasta el 23 de agosto.

Objetivo del encuentro

El X Encuentro de Obispos y Agentes de Pastoral Migratoria, que se desarrolla en la Casa de Retiro Espiritual Monte Alverna, tiene como lema “Caminando Junto al Migrante y Refugiado”. Este lema resalta la importancia de un acompañamiento articulado y con criterios claros para la acción pastoral. Durante los cinco días de trabajo, los participantes se enfocarán en asegurar que se respeten las normativas de los acuerdos y compromisos asumidos en el encuentro anterior, realizado en agosto de 2023 en San Salvador. La Iglesia Católica busca mediante este evento fortalecer un marco de trabajo que garantice los derechos humanos de los migrantes y refugiados.

La reflexión del Cardenal Czerny sobre la migración

En su visita al albergue, el Cardenal Czerny hizo un llamado a la reflexión sobre las circunstancias que obligan a miles de personas a dejar sus hogares. Subrayó que cuando la vida en los países de origen se vuelve insostenible, es una respuesta humana y natural buscar un lugar donde vivir dignamente. “Es importante entender que, en situaciones extremas, cualquiera de nosotros haría lo mismo”, expresó. También enfatizó que, ante el incremento en los flujos migratorios, no se trata de contar números, sino de brindar respuestas efectivas y humanas a quienes buscan refugio.

El impacto de la realidad migratoria en Darién

El Cardenal Álvaro Leonel Ramazzini Imeri, obispo de Huehuetenango, Guatemala, y presidente de la Red Clamor, compartió su conmoción al enterarse de los riesgos y las largas horas de viaje que enfrentan los migrantes al cruzar el Darién, especialmente los niños. “Es estremecedor pensar en los peligros que estas personas, especialmente los más vulnerables, enfrentan diariamente en su búsqueda de una vida mejor”, dijo. Este encuentro le permitió, junto con otros obispos, profundizar en la realidad migratoria y renovar su compromiso pastoral hacia los migrantes.

La colaboración entre la Iglesia y las autoridades de seguridad

Los líderes religiosos fueron recibidos en Darién por el Comisionado Alexis De Gracia, jefe de la Primera Brigada Oriental, y Larry Solís, Subdirector General del Servicio Nacional de Fronteras (SENAFRONT). Durante la reunión, se les informó sobre el corredor humanitario establecido en la frontera entre Panamá y Colombia, una medida destinada a garantizar la seguridad de los migrantes y proteger sus vidas en su tránsito por esta región peligrosa. Las autoridades también mencionaron que las repatriaciones serán voluntarias, subrayando el respeto a la decisión de cada migrante sobre su futuro.

Participación internacional en el encuentro

La visita a Darién incluye a destacados líderes de la Iglesia, como el Arzobispo de Panamá, José Domingo Ulloa Mendieta, quien resaltó la importancia de esta gira para comprender

mejor la realidad migratoria y fortalecer el acompañamiento pastoral. También la participación de Mons. Pedro Joaquín Hernández Cantarero, Obispo del Vicariato Apostólico de Darién; Mons. Mark Joseph Seitz, Obispo de la Diócesis de El Paso de los EE.UU. y presidente de la Comisión para Migrantes y Refugiados de la Conferencia Episcopal de Estados Unidos; y Mons. Carlos Alberto Santos García, Obispo Auxiliar de la Arquidiócesis de Monterrey-México, entre otros.



Apoyo y organización

Este encuentro es organizado por la Organización de Observatorio Socio-Pastoral de Movilidad Humana de Mesoamérica y El Caribe, la Pastoral de Movilidad Humana de la Conferencia Episcopal Panameña y la Arquidiócesis de Panamá. Además, cuenta con el apoyo del Dicasterio para el Servicio del Desarrollo Humano Integral de la Santa Sede.

Un compromiso renovado ante la crisis migratoria

El X Encuentro de Obispos y Agentes de Pastoral Migratoria es una respuesta contundente de la Iglesia Católica ante la crisis migratoria que afecta a Centroamérica, Norteamérica y el Caribe. La visita a Darién, así como las sesiones de trabajo programadas durante el encuentro, reflejan el compromiso de los líderes eclesiales de seguir caminando junto a los migrantes y refugiados, ofreciendo no solo apoyo espiritual, sino también soluciones concretas y seguras frente a los desafíos actuales.

Este encuentro reafirma la misión de la Iglesia de ser un faro de esperanza y solidaridad para quienes más lo necesitan.






