From the *Rector*

Dear IHM parishioners and people of good will: As we begin the new year, I ask God the Father to grant us the grace to begin anew and to be renewed by his presence.

As your pastor I am always impressed by the love I see in the families of our parish community, and I constantly give thanks to the Lord for you.

I am writing to you today with a heart full of gratitude both for your unwavering faith and with a deep desire to remind you of the powerful presence of God that resides within each of us, even during our lives' challenges. Today I remind you of the solid love and support you have received from God, especially during difficult times.

When we come to Mass, we go forward to take the host, meaning to receive the body and blood of Christ. I want to remind you that it is not just bread and wine, but Jesus who offers us during our lives this communion which has an effect on us—it makes us imitators of Christ, and so we become what we eat. Therefore, we are also called to share our very lives in service to God and to one another.

Today, I make a call to you not to be afraid to spend your life in service and support to one another. I see our young people in so much need of love, compassion and understanding. Our sick need companionship, our elderly need assistance, emotional support, and a sense of belonging. Many also need mobility, safe transportation, and social interaction.

Our community has been strengthened through acts of compassion and charity:

- The Pascuales have come back with great joy to serve during our parish Harvest Fest.
- The Bereavement Ministry (grief support group) has become a family who provides compassion, spiritual and emotional support to parishioners who are grieving the death of a loved one.
- The Rosary Makers are fulfilling our Lady's request at Fatima to pray the rosary daily and bring people closer to Jesus through Mary.
- Our Home Bound Ministers have the mission to recognize and share God's love with the home bound, bringing them the Eucharist and offering them compassion, prayers and the love of our community to enhance the unity of the family of faith in our parish.
- The Youth Group have been a great blessing in our community, they work so hard to bring hope and joy. They have empowered other young people to live as disciples of Jesus Christ in our world today and have been a great support to those preparing for the sacrament of confirmation.
- MDS Ministry has been a tremendous blessing for couples of all ages at our parish and a sign of hope for those who are having marital issues. They have also been a testimony of God's grace and healing.
- Lectors, choirs, ushers, ministers of communion, altar servers and sacristans, are epitomes of love to God in our community who serve with joy and gratitude to God. They work very hard on liturgical celebrations and for the glory of God.
- Mother Teresa of Calcutta Ministry offers valuable support and serves the poorest of the poor, the sick and destitute, those who come to our parish every Wednesday—always treating them with respect and love.
- The Sacred Heart of Jesus Society promote the love of Jesus Christ, serving the community and living a life of faith. As the baptized, they are people who witness to Christ's presence and his Gospel. They are also a great support during the Holy Hour of Reparation for our sins and our society today.
- The Altar Society is an anonymous group who generously respond to the important mission and needs of the altar and the sanctuary.
- Prayer and Life Workshops are an opportunity to learn how to pray. They teach the different methods of prayer and provide a perfect environment for an encounter with God.
- The Knights of Columbus are men putting their faith in action to defend, serve and protect families. What does it mean to be a Knight? It means a life of boldness in brotherhood, a life worth living. Charity and service are at the heart of their faith; they are here to build a bridge back to what matters; they also promote unity and humility in collaboration with their pastors who, by the example of Father Michael J. McGivney, shall always remain close to the people.
- The Neocatechumenal Way: I give you a new commandment: To love one another; as I have loved you, so that you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (JN 13, 34S). The Holy Spirit has risen in the Neocatechumenal way through various modalities of Evangelization, which has been confirmed and promoted by various Popes of the Church. Signs of faith, unity and love—even for the enemy. They are brothers and sisters who announce the kerygma and are a Christian community who bring God's love to all men.

They have become part of a mission of cooperating in the salvation of the souls. Through their kindness and dedication, they have made an outstanding difference in the lives of our people.

These ministries have set the example of commitment, and they have created a legacy of hope for the years ahead. We are all in mission together, we are all here for the same reason—because of Jesus. Our ordinary lives have been transformed in extraordinary ways, and we want everyone to experience that joy.

I want to thank you, too, for all that you are doing to be pastorally creative. I encourage you to keep being beacons of hope during this Jubilee year and in communion with our Holy Father, Pope Francis, and our Bishop to rejoice at God's presence.

As your priest I am here to walk alongside you on this journey. Please, I encourage you to actively practice your faith, to participate in the sacraments, and to reach out to others in need.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Sulpicius Severus

Feast Day: January 29

Sulpitius was born wealthy in 363AD. Known for his intelligence and eloquence he was one of the most successful lawyers of his day. Completely absorbed by worldly concerns, he married a wealthy and well-connected consul's daughter. When his wife, whom he loved deeply, died suddenly, He changed his ways.

Instead of letting himself collapse under the weight of despair, Sulpitius resumed energetically seeking his consolation in piety. he was content to surrender his possessions to the Church. His father was angry with him and he was the butt of his old friends' jokes. Twice he suffered serious illness but by divine grace, triumphed over every temptation.



He settled on an estate in Southern Gaul and set to work writing the life of St. Martin who was still alive at the time. The work became very influential on later authors writing lives of the saints.

San Sulpicio Severo

Sulpicio nació rico en el año 363 d.C. Conocido por su inteligencia y elocuencia, fue uno de los abogados más exitosos de su época. Completamente absorbido por las preocupaciones mundanas, se casó con la hija de un cónsul rico y bien relacionado. Cuando su esposa, a quien amaba profundamente, murió repentinamente, cambió sus costumbres.

En lugar de dejarse derrumbar bajo el peso de la desesperación, Sulpicio volvió a buscar enérgicamente su consuelo en la piedad. se contentó con entregar sus posesiones a la Iglesia. Su padre estaba enojado con él y él era el blanco de las bromas de sus viejos amigos. Dos veces sufrió graves enfermedades pero, por gracia divina, triunfó sobre todas las tentaciones.

Se instaló en una finca en el sur de la Galia y se puso a escribir la vida de San Martín, que todavía vivía en ese momento. La obra llegó a ser muy influyente en autores posteriores que escribieron vidas de los santos.

Patriarch Pizzaballa urges Christians to make pilgrimages to Holy Land

Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, invites Christians to return to the Holy Land on pilgrimage, saying their presence makes residents feel part of the universal Church.

"This ceasefire is a turning point that has been marked in the life of the Holy Land."

Patriarch Pierbattista Pizzaballa offered that assessment in a video message recorded from the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem.

The Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem was joined by the Custos of the Holy Land, Fr. Francesco Patton, in inviting Christians to make plans to visit the Holy Land on pilgrimage in the near future.

"Last year was a difficult year," said Patriarch Pizzaballa. "For this year, I want to express the appreciation we have for all the universal Church, for the support, for the prayer, or the unity and solidarity they expressed for the Holy Land."

He urged Christians worldwide to express their solidarity with the Holy Land, saying Jerusalem is safe, especially with the ceasefire between Israel and Hamas that went into effect on Sunday.

"The source and origin of hope is here at the Holy Sepulchre with Jesus, the Risen Lord," he added. "So, it's about time to take courage to come here. We are waiting for you."

PILGRIMAGE AND GREAT CATHOLIC FAMILY

In the video, Fr. Patton agreed with Patriarch Pizzaballa, highlighting the importance of pilgrimage to the land where Jesus was born, died, and rose again.

Standing in front of the Holy Sepulchre, he said Christians are "waiting for you, because when you come as pilgrims to the Holy Land, our small Christian community feels that we are part of a great family, the great family of the Catholic Church and Christians living all around the world."

"Please, don't fear," concluded Fr. Patton. "Don't be afraid. Come!"

Fr. Romanelli: Life slowly returns to Gaza after ceasefire deal

Following a phone call with Pope Francis this weekend, Fr. Gabriel Romanelli, the parish priest of the only Catholic Church in Gaza, tells Vatican News about the atmosphere as the ceasefire between Hamas and Israel comes into effect.

In the hours immediately after the ceasefire between Hamas and Israel took effect, Fr. Gabriel Romanelli, parish priest of the Holy Family Catholic Church, spoke about the situation after more than one year of conflict.

CEASEFIRE DOES NOT MEAN IMMEDIATE PEACE



Speaking to Bendetta Capelli, Fr. Romanelli explained the beginning of the ceasefire did not mean an immediate peace. "There was still gunfire and bombings," he described. "There was a delay in the release of hostage names."

But, the priest said, people are now beginning to believe there is real hope. "People are beginning to think and live again," he said.

In spite of the ceasefire deal, people are unable to return to their homes as it is still considered a military zone.

After 15 months of violence, Fr. Romanelli shared that many people have very simple wishes, such as going to the sea and swimming in it. Yet, the Israeli authorities have cautioned against it.

"People are beginning to think about how to rebuild their homes and restart their lives," Fr. Romanelli explained, "but there is still uncertainty."

HUMANITARIAN AID IS ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY

The parish priest stressed that humanitarian aid is essential. "Gaza is truly destroyed in all its infrastructure; only a few buildings remain standing," he said. In addition to food, the people in Gaza are in need of clean water and diesel for generators and electricity.

600 trucks will be bringing aid—200 more than what came before the conflict began. Fr. Romanelli painted a picture of the dire situation for the 2.3 million people living in Gaza: "During the conflict, there were days when

nothing got through, so 600 trucks is a good number, though certainly not enough."

He expressed his hope that the international community will help provide aid to the people in the Gaza Strip.

POPE FRANCIS HAS BECOME A PARISHIONER

the Pope for his solidarity. They made a banner and said a phrase in English, Spanish, Arabic, and Italian.

In turn, Pope Francis said how beautiful it was to see them and expressed his joy that peace was arriving in Gaza. This phrase, Fr. Romanelli said, made an impact on everyone. "We know that the ceasefire is not synonymous with peace," he explained, but "it is a step toward the end of this war and the beginning of a new chapter in the life of Gaza."

Every day, the Pope gives his blessing to the people of Gaza. Fr. Romanelli pointed out that, as the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem said, Pope Francis has "become one of us, one of our community, one of our parishioners."

LIFE BEGINS ANEW

60,000 people in December 2024 alone.

As the community waits for more aid sent by the Latin Patriarch and the Knights of Malta, Fr. Romanelli shared schools have reopened—only for girls, boys, and refugee children.

Even with a number of Church buildings damaged or destroyed, the parish priest expressed his hope that they will reopen and rebuild.

No «divagar», como sucede cuando se descuidan las relaciones fundamentales, las cuatro cercanías: cercanía con Dios, cercanía con el obispo, cercanía con la gente, cercanía entre los sacerdotes. Francisco lo recomendó a los seminaristas, diáconos, sacerdotes, estudiantes y formadores del Almo Colegio Capranica, recibidos en audiencia en la Sala Clementina del Palacio Apostólico hoy, 20 de enero, víspera de la memoria de Santa Inés, patrona del colegio. A la variopinta comunidad, en la que están representadas treinta y nueve diócesis distintas (veintiséis italianas

y catorce no italianas, entre ellas una eparquía de la Iglesia siro-malabar) y en la que «se refleja algo del único y múltiple rostro del santo pueblo fiel de Dios», el Papa recomendó también no olvidar precisamente «el santo pueblo fiel de Dios, que somos nosotros, la Iglesia», y no olvidar, como dice la

teología, que «es infalible en el creer», y pide también compromiso con la misión eclesial.

Cuiden la misión a la que Jesús llama a la Iglesia hoy, en tiempos complejos pero siempre alcanzados por la misericordia divina. Vivan esta misión con el estilo que apropiadamente calificamos de «sinodal».

VIVIR Y PROMOVER EL CAMINO SINODAL

Francisco ha recordado que el Documento Final de la XVI Asamblea del Sínodo de los Obispos define la sinodalidad como «un camino de renovación espiritual y de reforma estructural para hacer la Iglesia más participativa y misionera, es decir, para hacerla más capaz de caminar con cada hombre y cada mujer, irradiando la luz de Cristo», y ha exhortado «calurosamente» a sentirse «parte de este camino y a promoverlo desde ahora»: «en el Colegio, en las Universidades Pontificias donde estudian, en las parroquias de Roma, en la Casa Cárcel Rebibbia, en el Hospital Bambin Gesù», lugares donde la comunidad de Capranica tiene experiencia pastoral.

LA CARIDAD SE EXPRESA CONCRETAMENTE

A continuación, el Pontífice dio las gracias al Colegio, al que desde hace más de un siglo se confía «el servicio litúrgico en algunas celebraciones en la Basílica Papal de Santa María la Mayor» y que también participa de vez en cuando en las liturgias que se celebran en la Basílica de San Pedro, y recordó que no hay liturgia cristiana si los gestos que se realizan «no corresponden a una vida de fe, esperanza y caridad».

La caridad se expresa concretamente, no con palabras en su Colegio, sino también a través de un pequeño pero precioso servicio de asistencia a personas necesitadas que saben que pueden encontrar en ustedes un apoyo que les ayude a afrontar con menos fatiga el peso de la vida. Que este servicio los ayude también a no «divagar», como sucede cuando se pierde el contacto con quienes se encuentran en situaciones de marginalidad y penuria.

CUIDAR A LOS POBRES

Y es necesario cuidar, en particular, la «relación con los pobres», «mirarles a los ojos, tocarles las manos», concluyó el Papa, porque allí está Jesús: «Cuando confieso, pregunto, cuando hay ocasión: «¿Das limosna? Sí, sí, doy. Y cuando das limosna, ¿miras a los ojos de la persona y le tocas la mano, o tiras la moneda y sigues sin mirar?». Lo importante no es tanto la limosna, sino la relación con el pobre, con el pobre Jesús allí presente».
