












SCRUTINIES

During the lent season, during some masses, we will celebrate the scrutinies for those in our catechumenal process who are preparing to become full members of our Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist during the Easter Vigil.

Scrutiny: What is it?

Another name that can describe the scrutiny is "major exorcisms." As such, they are among the most ancient prayers in the Christian liturgical tradition. As early as the second century, Christian communities would help those who had been chosen for Baptism to prepare for their initiation by laying on hands and by prayers for protection and deliverance from evil. Today we continue to celebrate these powerful rituals, convinced that those about to enter a covenant with God in Christ stand in need of our prayers for deliverance and protection.

What can you do?

Just as our entire community is called to journey with the catechumens throughout the Lenten season, we recognize the need we all share for freedom from evil and its effects. We urge you to prepare for the celebration of the scrutinies in a personal way by discerning what is in your own life that needs to be free from sin's bondage. Join in spirit with all our community who turn to Jesus for freedom from sin and protection from all evil.

> Please continue to hold in your Lenten prayers the elect who count on you for their spiritual support in making their faith journey.

Our Battle with Temptation

Dear Brothers and Sisters: This first Sunday of Lent I want you to know that you are not alone on your journey. Ask the Lord to grant us the grace to walk together toward the Heavenly Father who always waits for us to return to him with sincere hearts.

I am aware of the seriousness and challenges of our spiritual warfare because we are not dealing with creatures form this world but with spiritual realities. We are constantly tempted and led to the spiritual desert of our lives. But today I want you to find courage in the Holy Spirit who is the Healer of souls. We are not orphans; we have a father who renders the heavens and comes to our assistance. In today's gospel our Savior and Redeemer teaches us how to overcome temptation and to battle against evil.

I ask the Holy Spirit to fill us with his grace, that our hearts may become strong enough to resist the deceit of the devil—to help us to see the seriousness of our sins and repent and change.

Please do not be deceived. "Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world" (1 John 4:1). For that reason, discerning and prayerful disposition are needed.

This Lenten season be aware of the many graces and spiritual weapons that the Lord has offered you. Prayer, fasting and giving alms should be essential for you. Don't waste these gifts which are given to us. Learn the value of them. "The unspiritual men do not receive the gifts of the Spirit of God," writes saint Paul. "For they are foolishness to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned" (1 Cor 2:14). The unfortunate reality is that the modern campaign of militant secular indoctrination has been so severe that only a dwindling remnant remains who believes or trusts in God's supernatural power and sanctifying grace. As a result, the spiritual hearts are reduced to the size of a thimble, only capable of receiving a few drops, if any, from the wellspring of God's graces (Rev 22.12). In spiritual terms this makes us puny and scrawny rather than strong and powerful warriors ready to confront the powers of darkness in the heavenly realm. With so many modern Christians ignoring the reality of grace, it is not any wonder that evil is advancing in our days.

Saint Paul reminds us, "The weapons of our battle are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds" (2 Cor 10:4). Yes, a Divine Power is available to all those who choose to enlist in God's army of spiritual warriors, ready to stand "God strong" against evil's clear and present danger.

This Lenten season allows the fire of the Holy Spirit to fill your hearts to ensure your efforts to combat evil. Be humble, be obedient, and trust in the Lord who constantly comes down to rescue those who trust in him and not just in themselves.

Are you free from selfishness and willing to enlist in Christ's fighting force and be the warrior he is calling you to be? Or are you still slave of your own passion and attachments? Finally, temptation will be there until the last minute of your life. It will leave you for a season, but it will come back to you in your desire to entertain it. However, Satan will tire of tempting you if you ignore his plans and overcome temptation by becoming a warrior of God.

God is ready to restore your innocence and restore the grace you received the day of your baptism. Come back to him with your whole heart. Remember he hears the cry of the poor and the humble

Por favor, no se dejen engañar. "Amados, no crean a todo espíritu, sino prueben los espíritus para ver si son de Dios, porque muchos falsos profetas han salido al mundo" (1 Juan 4:1). Por eso, se necesita una disposición de discernimiento y oración.

En este tiempo de Cuaresma, sean conscientes de las muchas gracias y armas espirituales que el Señor les ha ofrecido. La oración, el ayuno y la limosna deben ser esenciales para ustedes. No desperdicien estos dones que se nos dan. Aprendan el valor de ellos. "Los hombres carnales no perciben los dones del Espíritu de Dios", escribe san Pablo. "Porque para él son locura y no los puede entender, porque se disciernen espiritualmente" (1 Cor 2:14). La triste realidad es que la campaña moderna de adoctrinamiento secular militante ha sido tan severa que sólo queda un remanente cada vez menor que cree o confía en el poder sobrenatural de Dios y en su gracia santificadora. San Pablo nos recuerda: "Las armas de nuestra guerra no son armas del mundo, sino que tienen el poder divino para destruir fortalezas" (2 Cor 10:4). Sí, hay un Poder Divino disponible para todos aquellos que eligen alistarse en el ejército de guerreros espirituales de Dios, listos para permanecer "Dios fuerte" contra el peligro claro y presente del mal.

Este tiempo de Cuaresma permite que el fuego del Espíritu Santo llene tus corazones para asegurar tus esfuerzos para combatir el mal. Sé humilde, sé obediente y confía en el Señor que constantemente desciende para rescatar a quienes confían en él y no solo en sí mismos.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Christina Feast Day: March 11



St. Christina lived in the 3rd Century and was the daughter of a rich and powerful magistrate. Though his lovely daughter had drawn the eye of several suitors by the time she reached the age of 11, he wanted her to be a pagan priestess.

He locked his daughter in a room filled with gold and silver idols, then ordered her to burn incense before them. Saint Christina often peered at the world outside her window and decided there must have been a great creator of the

world. Turning to the idols, she came to believe they could only be false as they were forged by man and she began to pray to the creator of the world and asked him to reveal himself to her. That was when she felt an intense love blaze from deep within her heart and saw an angel appear before her. She began to fast and continued to pray. St. Christina smashed the false idols.

When her father came to visit and discovered the idols, he guestioned St. Christina but she refused to speak to him. Enraged, he began to slap his daughter's face until she began to speak - but her words were to proclaim her new faith and to share the Truth so he threw her in prison. During her time in captivity, she was tortured yet converted nearly 300 people. When she survived five days in a red-hot furnace, she was finally executed with a sword.

Santa Cristina Día festivo: 11 de marzo

Santa Cristina vivió en el siglo III y era hija de un magistrado rico y poderoso que quería que ella fuera una sacerdotisa pagana.

Encerró a su hija en una habitación llena de ídolos de oro y plata y luego le ordenó que quemara incienso ante ellos. Santa Cristina miraba a menudo el mundo fuera de su ventana y decidía que debía haber habido un gran creador del mundo. Refiriéndose a los ídolos, llegó a creer que sólo podían ser falsos ya que habían sido forjados por el hombre y comenzó a orar al creador del mundo y le pidió que se revelara a ella. Fue entonces cuando sintió un intenso amor arder desde lo más profundo de su corazón y vio aparecer un ángel ante ella. Ella comenzó a ayunar y continuó orando. Santa Cristina destruyó los falsos ídolos.

Cuando su padre vino de visita y descubrió los ídolos, la metió en prisión. Durante su tiempo en cautiverio, fue torturada y, sin embargo, convirtió a casi 300 personas. Cuando sobrevivió cinco días en un horno al rojo vivo. finalmente fue ejecutada con una espada.

The Pope invited the Church to pray for this intention in this month's The Pope Video, which is entrusted to the entire Catholic Church through the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network.

The images and audio in the video were prepared prior to the Holy Father's arrival at Rome's Gemelli Hospital on 14 February, where he continues his treatment for bilateral pneumonia.

In The Pope Video for March, the Holy Father acknowledged the great difficulties facing families.

'NO SUCH THING AS A PERFECT FAMILY'

"We all dream about a beautiful, perfect family. But," Pope Francis recognized, "there's no such thing as a perfect family," for each family "has its own problems," "as well as its tremendous joys."

While every member of the family is important because each is unique, the Bank lampated have first the differences are first and pair full.

the Pope lamented how often their differences cause conflict and painful wounds, as he suggests a solution.

'The best medicine to heal the pain of a wounded family," he stressed, "is forgiveness," adding that forgiveness requires giving our family members "another chance."

"God," Pope Francis pointed out, "does this with us all the time." Reminding that God's patience is infinite, the Holy Father reminded how He "forgives us, lifts us up, and gives us a new start

RENEWING THE FAMILY THROUGH FORGIVENESS

In the same way, the Pope suggested, pardoning one another "always renews the family" and makes "it look forward with hope."
Even when there's no possibility of the "happy ending" we'd like, he

noted, God's grace gives us the strength to forgive.

Doing so, he explained, "brings peace," because "it frees us from sadness, and, above all, from resentment."

Pope Francis concluded by saying, "Let us pray that broken families might discover the cure for their wounds through forgiveness, rediscovering each other's gifts, even in their differences.'

"Frente a la cultura de la muerte y del descarte, nuestra respuesta debe ser un compromiso firme y decidido con la cultura de la vida y la dignidad humana". Este és el llamamiento que la Conferencia

Episcopal Mexicana (CEM) dirige con motivo de la "Semana por la Vida 2025", que se celebrará del 24 al 28 de marzo durante el Año Jubilar. Según plantean, esto implica formar una conciencia iluminada por la verdad, defender la vida desde la concepción hasta la muerte natural, promover la familia y la educación en valores, combatir la violencia con la paz del Evangelio, acompañar a las víctimas de violencia y fortalecer tanto la evangelización como el compromise social violencia y fortalecer tanto la evangelización como el compromiso social.

'Queremos ser mensajeros de esperanza y vida, acogiendo con amor la fraternidad", expresa el Episcopado. "Seamos mensajeros de esperanza y vida, acogiendo con amor al enfermo, al débil y al vulnerable. Acojamos a nuestros enfermos, especialmente a aquellos que se encuentran cerca de la resurrección de la vida en Cristo. Seamos mensajeros de esperanza y

vida, rehabilitando a quienes han caído en las garras del crimen". Los obispos afirman que "la dignidad humana ha sido gravemente afectada por el secuestro, la extorsión y la violencia" en una situación que definen como "desafiante" para el país. Se trata de una realidad "dolorosa", subrayan, marcada por la proliferación de una "cultura de la muerte y el descarte", que se manifiesta de diversas formas: desde la despenalización y promoción del aborto hasta la violencia descontrolada, la delincuencia organizada y el narcotráfico, que han convertido vastas regiones en "zonas de guerra".

Ante este contexto, el comunicado de los Obispos cita un pasaje de la bula de indicción del Año Santo, Spes non confundit, en la que el Pontífice afirma: "San Pablo sabe que la vida está hecha de alegrías y dolores, que el amor se pone a prueba cuando aumentan las dificultades y la esperanza parece derrumbarse frente al sufrimiento". Por ello, insisten en que la Iglesia nos invita a mirar el futuro con esperanza y reafirma su compromiso inguebrantable con la defensa de la vida desde la concepción hasta la muerte natural.

Los Pastores también hacen un llamado a ser mensajeros de esperanza y vida para los migrantes. Asimismo, tienen la certeza de que "Dios camina con su pueblo" y desean que la esperanza "sea un faro que oriente nuestro caminar, porque sabemos que el Amor nos ha salvado y nos sostiene".

En este sentido, animan a trabajar juntos, con valentía, "por un México donde la vida sea respetada y promovida en todas sus etapas". Por último, los prelados encomiendan la "Semana por la Vida" a la Virgen de Guadalupe, "para que interceda por nosotros y nos ayude a ser constructores de una auténtica cultura de la vida".

EU Bishops: Ukraine's struggle 'will be decisive for the fate of Europe and the world'

The Presidency of the Commission of the Bishops' Conferences of the EU releases a statement stressing the importance of continuining to support Ukraine and its people.

A statement issued on March 4 by the Presidency of the Commission of the Bishops' Conferences of the European Union stresses that Ukraine's struggle for peace "will also be decisive for the fate of Europe and the

The message reaffirms the European Union Bishops' continued support of Ukraine and its people, "who have been suffering from Russia's unjustifiable full-scale invasion for more than three years."

A FATE WHICH EXTENDS BEYOND BORDERS

The Presidency of the Commission's statement shares their ongoing prayers for those who have died, those who are wounded or fighting for their country, and those who have been displaced as a result of the war.

The statement also expresses gratitude to the EU decision-makers for providing unprecedented humanitarian, political, economic, financial as well as military support to Ukraine and its people over the past years."

More than simply describing their sentiment, the bishops use the statement to highlight how the fate of Ukraine will extend far beyond its borders and instead affect the entire world.

A NEW CHAPTER OF WAR

Recognizing the "geopolitical complexities and the unpredictability of actions" of some countries, the bishops call on the EU and its member states to "remain united in their commitment to supporting Ukraine and its people."

Following the third anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion, the Commission labels the attack as a "blatant violation of international law" and points out that the acts committed against civilians during this time "demand a consequent pursuit of justice and accountability."

WHAT PEACE SHOULD LOOK LIKE

This accountability would come in the form of a comprehensive, just, and lasting peace in Ukraine. The statement explains this can only be achieved through negotiations, supported by global solidarity, and including Ukraine in discussions. The EU bishops "firmly reject any attempts to distort the reality of this aggression."

Peace must be in accordance with international law and must create the needed environment to allow Ukrainian families to reunite and "live a life in dignity, security and freedom in their sovereign and independent homeland?

Yet, the bishops also stress the importance of protecting the rights of all communities, "including the Russian-speaking minority." This should be part of the reconstruction of Ukraine's infrastructure and "Russia, the aggressor, must adequately participate in this effort." It must be a peace created through international cooperation and solidarity.

The bishops do not shy away from encouraging the EU to move forward with adding Ukraine as a member state in a "timely and fair manner." The Commission of EU bishops express its hope that the European Union will continue to live its vocation as a promoter or "peace and an anchor of stability to its neighborhood and to the world."

As Christians prepare for Lent to begin on March 5, the bishops entrust Ukraine and Europe to Jesus through the intercession of Mary, the Queen of The Faithful Can Witness to the Power of God's Love by


