From the

*Pastor*

“If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?” Luke 11:1-13

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Today’s Gospel of Luke presents us the prayer par excellence through Jesus, our master! It is the Our Father prayer, apparently easy to pray but difficult to put into practice.

Beginning with the division existing among us around the world: When will the day come that we will realize that we all are God’s children? Of course, it does not give us the right to do whatever we want. There are morals, values and God’s commandments that are necessary to follow if we are to call ourselves true Christians.

I usually try to explain the meaning of each word in this powerful prayer. But today, I would like you to contemplate the great love and compassion of God our Father. Jesus reveals the face of the Father and helps us to understand what he has done for us: What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? He admonishes us and helps us to see our weakness, and tells us how generous, loving and close to us is God the Father. The Father wants to give us not just material things but also the Holy Spirit. But we must ask for it.

So, what do you want? What are you asking for? What do you need? A house? An airplane? Do you want to win the lottery? Well go first and buy the ticket! The Lord can give you this and more, but do you really think that this is going to bring you happiness? The Lord wants you to have the Holy Spirit because if you have him, you have everything! But define what you want! Some of us don’t even know what we want. There is dissatisfaction or unhappiness even when we may think we have everything we want.

According to St Augustine, this feeling of dissatisfaction arises from man’s fallen condition. Although man has an innate potential to relate to God (substitute ‘the absolute’ or ‘the infinite’ if you are discomfited by the religious connotations of the term ‘God’), this potential can never be fully realized, and so he yearns for other things to substitute for it. Yet these other things do not satisfy, and he is left with an insatiable feeling of longing—longing for something that cannot be defined.

“Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be open to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened”. Sometimes we may think that God does not listen to us. But the problem is that we don’t know how to pray, our pride is not letting us see that we are not asking for the right thing. We want what is convenient—everything—but not God; and without God there is nothing, there is not happiness or love.

Why are we so empty or angry toward God and others? Because we need joy! And joy is not the absence of suffering, but the presence of God. We need God, we need to pray to him and let his will be done in our lives.

May the Lord Bless you! Happy Sunday!

“Si ustedes, que son malos, saben dar cosas buenas a sus hijos, ¿cuánto más el Padre celestial dará el Espíritu Santo a quienes se lo pidan?” Lucas 11:1-13

Queridos hermanos y hermanas el Evangelio de Lucas hoy nos presenta la oración por excelencia, enseñada por Jesús, nuestro Maestro. Es la oración a nuestro Padre, aparentemente fácil de rezar, pero difícil de poner en práctica.

Comenzando con la división que existe entre nosotros y en todo el mundo, ¿cuándo llegará el día en que nos demos cuenta de que todos somos hijos de Dios? Claro que esto no nos da derecho a hacer lo que queramos. Hay valores morales y mandamientos de Dios que debemos seguir si nos consideramos verdaderos cristianos.

Usualmente intento explicar el significado de cada palabra en esta poderosa oración. Pero hoy me gustaría que contemplaran el gran amor y compasión de Dios, nuestro Padre.

Jesús nos revela el rostro del Padre y nos ayuda a comprender lo que ha hecho por nosotros: ¿Qué padre entre ustedes le daría a su hijo una víbora cuando éste le pide un pescado? ¿O darle un escorpión cuando le pide un huevo? Nos amonesta y nos ayuda a ver nuestra debilidad, y nos dice cuán generoso, amoroso y cercano es Dios Padre. El Padre quiere darnos no solo cosas materiales, sino también el Espíritu Santo, pero debes pedirlo.

Pero ¿qué quieres? ¿Qué pides? ¿Qué necesitas? ¿Una casa, un avión, quieres ganar la lotería? ¡Pues ve primero y compra el billete! El Señor puede darte esto y más, pero ¿de verdad crees que esto te traerá la felicidad?

El Señor quiere que tengas el Espíritu Santo, porque si lo tienes, ¡lo tienes todo! Pero define lo que quieres. Algunos ni siquiera lo sabemos; hay insatisfacción o infelicidad incluso cuando crees tener todo lo que deseas. Según San Agustín, este sentimiento de insatisfacción surge de la condición caída del hombre. Aunque el hombre tiene un potencial innato para relacionarse con Dios (sustitúyalo por "lo absoluto" o "lo infinito" si le incomodan las connotaciones religiosas del término "Dios"), este potencial nunca se puede realizar plenamente, por lo que busca otras cosas que lo sustituyan. Sin embargo, estas otras cosas no lo satisfacen, y le queda un anhelo insaciable: un anhelo por algo indefinible.

"Pidan y se les dará, busquen y encontrarán, toquen y se les abrirá. Porque quien pide, recibe; y quien busca, encuentra; y al que toca, se le abre". A veces pensamos que Dios no nos escucha, pero el problema es que no sabemos orar, nuestro orgullo no nos deja ver que no estamos pidiendo lo correcto; por conveniencia lo queremos todo, menos a Dios; y sin Dios no hay nada, no hay felicidad ni amor.

¿Por qué estamos tan vacíos o enojados con Dios y con los demás? ¡Porque necesitamos alegría! Y la alegría no es la ausencia de sufrimiento, sino la Presencia de Dios. Necesitamos a Dios, necesitamos orar y permitir que se haga Su voluntad en nuestras vidas.

¡Que el Señor los bendiga! ¡Feliz domingo!

¿Cuánto tiempo más debemos esperar, qué más debemos ver para detener la barbarie de la guerra — como reiteró recientemente el Papa León— que estalla a diario desde Gaza? Toda guerra es terrible y debe detenerse: en Ucrania, Sudán, Myanmar, Yemen... incluso la muerte de una sola persona determina la transformación de la humanidad en su conjunto. Pero en Gaza, la gente ya no muere simplemente por el horror de la guerra, muere de hambre, ya no solo por las armas: los niños dejan de llorar, los ancianos de abrazarse, los adultos de caminar, porque sus corazones dejan de respirar, sus cuerpos carecen de recursos.

Sin comida ni agua, la gente muere de hambre ante un mundo informado y tecnológico que relata, documenta y devora cada suceso con videos y fotos, sin lograr derrotar la inhumanidad. Ante todo esto, no podemos permanecer indiferentes, no podemos insensibilizarnos ni mirar hacia otro lado tras presenciar el horror y la violencia. Todos estamos llamados a ser constructores de paz, aceptación, diálogo, fraternidad y esperanza, y cada uno es una voz que puede apoyar la bondad, la dignidad y la vida. Y tantas voces que se convierten en actos de alivio, mediación y apoyo no pueden ser ignoradas: los políticos y los gobiernos no pueden hacer la vista gorda. Y así, se fortalece la labor diplomática, se concretan las vías de ayuda y se construye una verdadera humanidad, donde la paz no es solo una palabra invocada, sino un hecho.

## Pope: Migrants are “witnesses of hope” in a devastated world



In his Message for the 111th World Day of Migrants and Refugees, Pope Leo XIV emphasizes the important witness that migrants and refugees offer in a world affected by conflict and inequality in hoping and searching for a better and more peaceful future.

Pope Leo XIV highlights how migrants and refugees are witnesses of hope and tenacity amidst adversity and calls for a future of peace and respect for human dignity, in his Message for the 111th World Day of Migrants and Refugees, released on

Friday, July 25. This year, rather than being celebrated on September 24 as usual, the World Day will coincide with the Jubilee of Migrants and of Missions, which takes place on October 4 and 5. This annual event encourages the faithful to show support and closeness to the millions of people who are forced to leave their homes and places of origin. According to the United Nations, at the end of 2024, around 123.4 million people were forcibly displaced across the world due to persecution, conflict, violence or other issues.

### A desire for peace is essential for humanity

Pope Leo XIV begins his Message underlining how the world is “faced with frightening scenarios and the possibility of global devastation”.

“The prospect of a renewed arms race and the development of new armaments, including nuclear weapons, the lack of consideration for the harmful effects of the ongoing climate crisis, and the impact of profound economic inequalities make the challenges of the present and the future increasingly demanding”, he explained, adding that these issues have forced millions to leave their homelands.

He points out that the “widespread tendency” to look at “the interests of limited communities” poses a threat to sharing “responsibility, multilateral cooperation, the pursuit of the common good and global solidarity”.

For Pope Leo, “it is important there be a growing desire in people’s hearts for a future of peace and of respect for the dignity of all”. He stresses that “such a future is essential to God’s plan for humanity and the rest of creation”, citing passages from the biblical book of Zechariah emphasizing that, as Christians, “we believe and hope in its full realization, for the Lord is always faithful to His promises”.

### Migrants and refugees, witnesses of hope through their stories

The Pope explains that migrants and refugees thus have an important role to play in showing hope in a better future. For the Catholic Church, “the virtue of hope responds to the aspiration to happiness which God has placed in the heart of every man and woman”; and this search is “certainly one of the main motivations” for migrants, refugees and displaced persons, making them “messengers” and “privileged witnesses of hope”.

“Indeed, they demonstrate this daily through their resilience and trust in God, as they face adversity while seeking a future in which they glimpse that integral human development and happiness are possible”, he says, comparing the experience of the people of Israel described in the Bible.

“In a world darkened by war and injustice, even when all seems lost”, he stresses, “their courage and tenacity bear heroic testimony to a faith that sees beyond what our eyes can see and gives them the strength to defy death on the various contemporary migration routes”.

### The importance of welcoming migrants

At the same time, Pope Leo explains that communities that welcome migrants and refugees can also be “a living witness to hope” as they show “the promise of a present and a future where the dignity of all as children of God is recognized”.

“In this way, migrants and refugees are recognized as brothers and sisters, part of a family in which they can express their talents and participate fully in community life”, he says.

### Catholic migrants and refugees can revitalize the Church

On a spiritual level, Pope Leo highlights that migrants and refugees also remind the Church “of her pilgrim dimension, perpetually journeying towards her final homeland, sustained by a hope that is a theological virtue”. He encourages the Church and its members to be “God’s people journeying towards the heavenly homeland” and avoid the “temptation of ‘sedentarization’” and becoming “of the world”.

In this regard, the Pope believes Catholic migrants and refugees have a special mission in becoming “missionaries of hope in the countries that welcome them, forging new paths of faith where the message of Jesus Christ has not yet arrived or initiating interreligious dialogue based on everyday life and the search for common values”.

“This is a true *missio migrantium*, a mission carried out by migrants, for which adequate preparation and ongoing support must be ensured through effective inter-ecclesial cooperation”, he says.

“With their spiritual enthusiasm and vitality, they can help revitalize ecclesial communities that have become rigid and weighed down, where spiritual desertification is advancing at an alarming rate”, he says. “Their presence, then, should be recognized and appreciated as a true divine blessing, an opportunity to open oneself to the grace of God, who gives new energy and hope to His Church”.



## Saint of the week / Santo de la semana

St. Ignatius of Loyola, priest, Founder of the Jesuits



S. Iñigo López de Loyola, fundador de la Compañía de Jesús

Iñigo López de Loyola nació en 1491 en Azpeitia, en Guipúzcoa (España). Su aspiración era ser caballero. Por eso, su padre lo envió a Castilla, junto a don Juan Velázquez de Cuéllar, ministro del rey Fernando el Católico. La vida

#### Pride shattered

Iñigo López de Loyola thirsted for fame and glory. The boy, born in 1491 into the lesser nobility in Spain's Basque country, learned sword-fighting and all things military. As he grew, he danced, got into fights, toyed with women, and dreamed of imitating Spain's knight-hero, El Cid. It seemed as if his dream was being realized for a time: the man Iñigo was esteemed as a courageous soldier.

But in 1521, at Pamplona, a French cannonball shattered his leg. The leg was set poorly and was healing crooked. The soldier, concerned with his looks and prowess, begged the doctor to break it again. It was a long convalescence. Iñigo begged for chivalric romances to read to while away the time. There were no such books in his family's castle, however, so he was brought books he had no desire to read: a life of Jesus and lives of the saints. Boredom got the better of him, however, and at last he opened these volumes. It was like opening the covers onto a new world.

Iñigo began to imagine the life of Christ as he prayed, picturing the scenes. He began to think that people like St. Francis were braver than the bravest soldiers he knew. He still dreamed of knightly glory, but noticed that these dreams left him with a bitter aftertaste. Thoughts of the Lord or of the saints' sacrifices, on the other hand, were hard but left him with an abiding peace. He was being taught, he realized later: it was his first introduction to the discernment of spirits.

#### Brothers

Iñigo, who began to go by the name of Ignatius, did make it to the Holy Land, but he soon returned to Europe. He started preaching. This was not looked upon kindly by the Inquisition, which interrogated him but at last set him free. He set off for Paris to study. At the university there, he found roommates: another Basque, Francis Xavier, and the Frenchman, Peter Faber. On August 15, 1534, Ignatius, his roommates, and four others took vows. If they could not go to the Holy Land, they promised to place themselves at the service of the Pope in an obedience that was simply an expression of love. Five years later, that small group of friends adopted the name, "the Society of Jesus." The Jesuits were born.

Now a priest, Ignatius became the Jesuit's first Father General, until his death on July 31, 1556. He sent his companions on mission, some to faraway lands.

Wherever they went, they carried with them what Iñigo had learned at Manresa: man was created, not to seek glory, but to love, serve and praise. To give glory, or to live "for the greater glory of God."

en la corte formó el carácter y los modales del joven, que comenzó a leer poemas y a cortejar a las damas. Durante su larga convalecencia, tuvo ocasión de leer la Leyenda Áurea de Jacopo da Varagine, y la Vida de Cristo de Lodolfo Cartusiano. Ambos textos influyeron enormemente en su personalidad, convenciéndolo de que el único Señor al que valía la pena seguir era Jesucristo.

#### Una peregrinación providencial

Decidido a peregrinar a Tierra Santa, Iñigo llegó hasta el santuario de Montserrat, donde hizo voto de castidad y cambió sus ricos vestidos por los de un mendigo. Barcelona, desde cuyo puerto debía embarcarse hacia Italia, padecía una epidemia de peste, e Iñigo tuvo que detenerse en Manresa, donde vivió un largo periodo de aislamiento que dedicó a la meditación y a la escritura de una serie de consejos y reflexiones que, reelaborados más tarde, formaron la base de los Ejercicios Espirituales. Llegó por fin a Tierra Santa deseando establecerse allí, pero el superior de los franciscanos se lo impidió, considerando que sus conocimientos teológicos eran demasiado pobres. Iñigo regresó entonces a Europa y comenzó estudios de gramática, filosofía y teología, primero en Salamanca y después en París.

En la capital francesa cambió su nombre por el de Ignacio, en homenaje al santo de Antioquía, a quien admiraba por su amor a Cristo y su obediencia a la Iglesia. Estos rasgos serían más tarde pilares fundamentales de la Compañía de Jesús. Para 1534, tenía seis seguidores: Francisco Javier, Pedro Fabro, Alfonso Salmerón, Diego Laínez, Nicolás Bobedilla y Simón Rodríguez.

El día 15 de agosto de 1534, los siete juran en Montmartre servir a nuestro Señor, dejando todas las cosas del mundo, y fundan la Sociedad de Jesús, que luego sería llamada la Compañía de Jesús. Deciden viajar a Roma para ponerse a las órdenes del Papa. El Papa Pablo III les dio la aprobación y les permitió ordenarse sacerdotes.

La Compañía de Jesús estuvo animada desde el principio por el celo misionero: los sacerdotes Peregrinos o Reformados (solo más adelante asumieron el nombre de Jesuitas) fueron enviados por toda Europa, y luego a Asia y al resto del mundo, llevando por todas partes su carisma de pobreza, caridad y obediencia absoluta a la voluntad del Papa. Uno de los principales problemas que Ignacio tuvo que afrontar fue la preparación cultural y teológica de los jóvenes. Por esta razón, formó un cuerpo de docentes y fundó diversos colegios que, con los años, adquirieron fama internacional gracias al elevado nivel científico y a un programa de estudios que fue tomado como modelo incluso por instituciones no religiosas.
