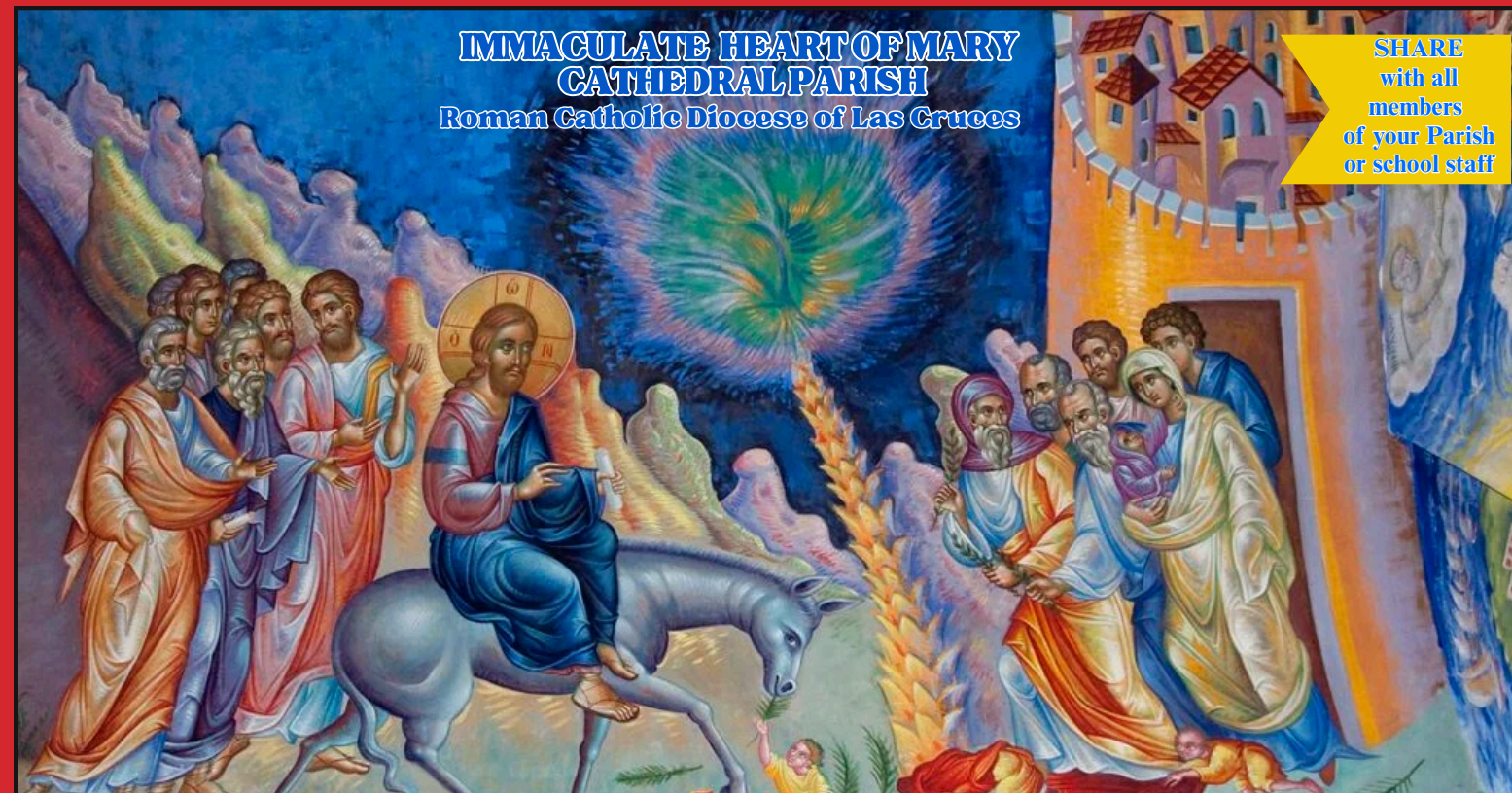

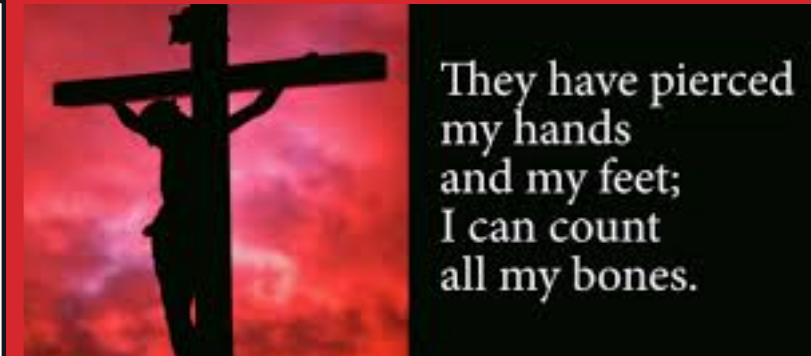

Brother Matthew: Young people desire real connection with God and each other

Following his recent audience with Pope Leo XIV, Brother Matthew, prior of the Taizé Community, reflects on the challenges facing young people in a world filled with indifference and war.

Pope Leo XIV met with the prior of the Taizé Community, Brother Matthew, on Saturday, March 21, for a private audience. In the following interview with Vatican News, Brother Matthew expressed his appreciation for the Pope's support for the ecumenical mission of Taizé and its work with young people.

Q: Brother Matthew, on Saturday you met with Pope Leo. What can you tell us about the audience?

First of all, it was my second audience with the Holy Father. I had already met him in July of last year. It has historically always been a tradition that the Prior of Taizé comes to Rome in March, and I asked if it would be possible to meet with him again. They said yes right away, which was a great joy.

He was very confirming toward the vocation of our community. We are an ecumenical community, with brothers from different Christian denominations. This sign of unity is very important for us. But also, this attention to the ministry of the Bishop of Rome as a servant of unity within the people of God. He was very confirming in that and very thankful. The two main topics we spoke about were unity and peace, which have been central themes for him from the outset.

We discussed the suffering in regions affected by war, including Ukraine and the Middle East. We shared our concerns and reflected on what signs of solidarity we can offer, and how to open paths for dialogue, because we see that weapons do not produce the result that is peace. We explored ways to foster true paths toward peace. We also talked about unity among Christians, as well as unity within the Catholic Church, both very important topics.

I could see how much the Holy Father cares about the situation of young people today. After the pandemic, young people often live in great isolation and sometimes feel they don't need contact with others. At Taizé, we welcome a wide variety of young people with different experiences. Many come from situations of isolation, but through the experience that we offer, they rediscover the importance of life with others, life in community.

The impression I always get when I meet Pope Leo is that he has a remarkable capacity to listen. He gives the time you need and never hurries, which is very moving. I hope he manages, because his days are very long. There is a great generosity of spirit and a real desire to journey together with those who come to visit him, which I deeply felt and am very grateful for.

In today's world, we sometimes feel that people in positions of responsibility or politicians just shout at each other. How can we learn to listen again? Listening does not mean we must agree on everything, but it creates a space where we might take steps together we never expected before. Listening to others and respecting them, even when we differ, is a true sign for the world today. Estudio 9. Cómo vivir la Semana Santa

Cómo vivir la Semana Santa desde el silencio, la oración el ayuno y la conversión. Cómo se vive en Jerusalén, que están por vivirla con restricciones según anunció el cardenal Patriarca Pizzaballa y el significado de la pascua judía y cómo Jesús le dio un nuevo sentido. Estos los temas abordados esta mañana en Estudio 9

Patricia Ynestroza - Ciudad del Vaticano

En Estudio 9 hemos conversado con el padre Gianpaolo Cesareo del diócesis de Namur en Bélgica sobre cómo vivir la Semana Santa. Implica acompañar a Jesús en su pasión, muerte y resurrección mediante la oración, el silencio, el ayuno y la participación en los oficios litúrgicos. Es un tiempo para la reflexión personal y familiar, priorizando la asistencia a la iglesia durante el Triduo Pascual (Jueves, Viernes y Sábado Santo).

Claves principales para vivir la Semana Santa:

- **Participación Litúrgica:** Asistir a la iglesia para celebrar el Triduo Pascual: la Última Cena (Jueves), la Pasión del Señor (Viernes) y la Vigilia Pascual (Sábado).
- **Oración y Reflexión:** Dedicar tiempo al silencio interior, la lectura de los Evangelios y la meditación sobre el amor redentor de Jesús.
- **Ayuno y Abstinencia:** El Viernes Santo es un día de ayuno y abstinencia de carne, uniendo el sacrificio personal al sufrimiento de Cristo.
- **Sentido Familiar:** Compartir momentos de oración y orar juntos en el hogar, transmitiendo el significado de estos días a los niños.
- **Actos de Piedad:** Rezar el Vía Crucis para meditar en el camino al Calvario.

Cómo se vive o se vivirá en Jerusalén considerando que este año estará la ciudad llena de restricciones. El padre nos cuenta cómo es vivir de cerca, en esa ciudad la Semana Mayor. En un mensaje, el cardenal Pizzaballa, patriarca latino de Jerusalén, explica que, debido a las restricciones impuestas por el conflicto en curso, la tradicional procesión del Domingo de Ramos en el Monte de los Olivos se cancelará y la Misa Crismal se pospondrá. Si bien las iglesias de la diócesis permanecen abiertas, se invita a los fieles a unirse en oración el próximo sábado 28 de marzo, rezando el Rosario para implorar el don de la paz.

El padre Cesareo también explicó el significado de la pascua judía, y como Jesús le dio un nuevo sentido con su Resurrección del paso de la muerte a la vida.

Paster

“Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest.” Matthew 21:1-11

Dear brothers and sisters:

grace and peace from the Lord Jesus Christ. This Sunday is called Palm Sunday. Let us lift the branches of our hearts; we have a King, and His Kingdom will last forever! But He does not come as a mighty warrior, but as the Servant of the Lord, ready to lay down His life for us.

As we celebrate the triumphant entrance into Jerusalem, it is necessary for us as Catholics to understand the meaning of this Paschal Triduum. I have told you that we are people of the Resurrection. If Jesus had not resurrected, everything we are doing here would be in vain. But it is also important for us to remember that there is no Resurrection without crucifixion.

To meditate on the Lord's Passion and Crucifixion is essential for our spiritual growth. Sometimes we only want the nicest part. Please be aware of today's dangers for our souls. I don't know if it is just my impression, but more and more we are seduced by a world of noise and distraction, making it difficult to hear Jesus' invitation to follow Him closely.

I remind you of Pope Leo XIV's invitation for Holy Week 2026. He invites the faithful to enter the most sacred week of the year by moving from the spiritual “tombs” of selfishness, violence, and materialism into the light of God's love. His invitation emphasizes deep conversion, renewal of faith, and active participation in the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ.

We are already immersed in the spiritual atmosphere of Holy Week; we are on the eve of the Easter Triduum. From Holy Thursday until Sunday, we will live the central days of the Liturgical Year, celebrating the mystery of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord. And we live this mystery every time we celebrate the Eucharist. When we go to Mass, we do not go only to pray—no: we go to renew, to make present again, this mystery, the Paschal Mystery. It is as though we were going to Calvary—it is the same—to renew and make present the Paschal Mystery. Holy Thursday at 7:00 PM (Institution of the Eucharist) we will relive the Mass known as In Coena Domini, that is, the Mass in which we commemorate the Last Supper. I pray that little by little we come to a better understanding of the Eucharist as a Holy Sacrifice, memorial, and mystery of our faith.

On the other hand, we are also going to celebrate the institution of the priesthood and our commitment to love. I pray that the Lord may gather us and make us one in His love.

After the procession with the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose, you will have the opportunity to visit the different altars of repose of the parishes of the Las Cruces Vicariate. This is a time of grace, a time to silence our minds and hearts and to contemplate the great love of God for humanity.

Good Friday is the day of penance, fasting, and prayer. In the intensity of the rite, through the Liturgical Action, the Crucifix will be presented to us to adore. This liturgy will take place inside the Cathedral at 3:00 PM. Through the texts of Sacred Scripture and the liturgical prayers, we will gather as though we were on Calvary to commemorate the redemptive Passion and Death of Jesus Christ.

This year we are going to have the live meditation of the Passion of Christ before going to the liturgical celebration of the Lord's Passion in the Cathedral. I remind you that it is not a show; it is a meditation and contemplation of Christ's love for us poor sinners. It is a responsibility it is to represent any of the people who were present during the Lord's Passion. We may be like the sensitive Cyrenian who helped Jesus carry His cross. Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday are a great opportunity to allow our Divine Redeemer to save us.

Holy Saturday is the day of silence, lived by the first disciples in mourning and bewilderment, shocked by Jesus' ignominious death. While the Word is silent, while Life is in the tomb, those who had hoped in Him were put to a difficult test. They felt like orphans—perhaps even orphaned by God.

This Saturday is also Mary's day: she too lived it in tears, but her heart was full of faith, full of hope, full of love. The Mother of Jesus had followed her Son along the path of sorrows and remained at the foot of the Cross, with her soul pierced. But when it all seemed to be over, she kept watch, she kept vigil, in expectation, maintaining her hope in the promise of God who raises the dead. Thus, in the world's darkest hour, she became the Mother of believers, the Mother of the Church, and a sign of hope. Her witness and her intercession sustain us when the weight of the cross becomes too heavy for each one of us.

Easter: In the darkness of Holy Saturday, joy and light will break through with the rites of the Easter Vigil and, in the late evening, the festive singing of the Alleluia. It will be an encounter in faith with the Risen Christ, and the joy of Easter will continue throughout the following fifty days, until the coming of the Holy Spirit.

I hope we can understand the meaning of this holy night and why we call it a vigil. The Exsultet will recall and express the meaning of this holy night. This holy night is the night of our salvation, when we go from darkness to light, from the slavery of sin to the freedom of the children of God. It is the moment when heaven and earth come together and rejoice because the tomb is empty—the victory of Christ over death.

Please enter this Holy Week with sincere hearts and sing with us: Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

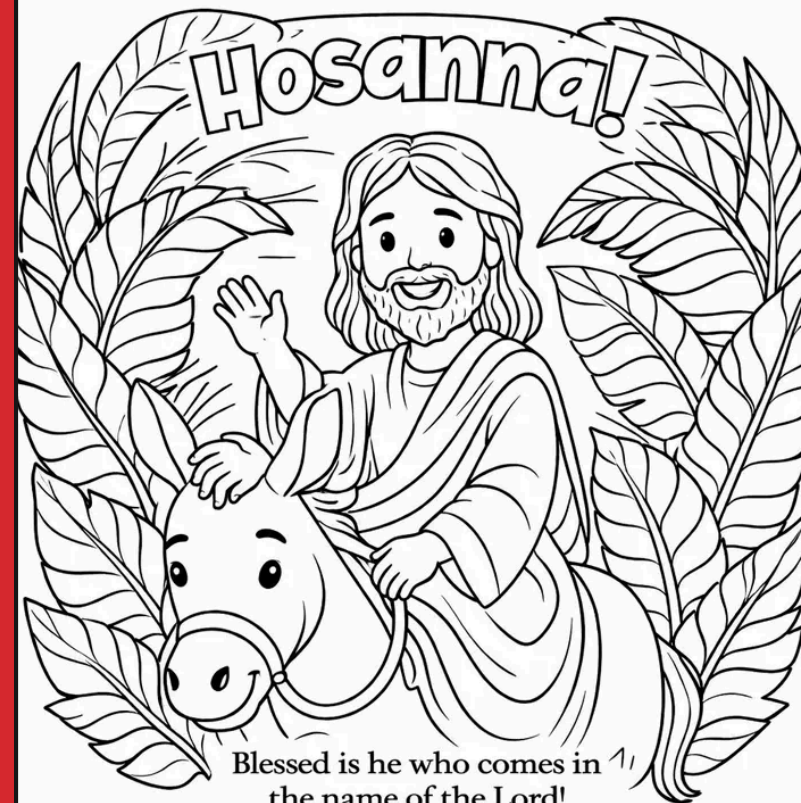
