Día de la Candelaria (Candlemas) – February 2

Día de la Candelaria, or Candlemas, is celebrated on February 2nd, 40 days after Christmas. This feast marks the Catholic observance of Jesus' presentation at the Temple and Mary's purification, rooted in the Gospel of Luke. Families traditionally bring candles to be blessed and often share tamales, blending religious tradition with indigenous customs, especially in Mexico.

Catholic Teaching & Significance

- **Feast of the Presentation:** Commemorates Jesus' presentation at the Jerusalem Temple by Mary and Joseph, fulfilling Old Testament law for firstborn sons.
- **Purification of Mary:** Marks Mary's purification 40 days after childbirth, a Jewish ritual, celebrated as the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
- **Light of Christ:** Candles blessed on this day symbolize Jesus as the Light of the World, bringing protection and spiritual illumination to homes.
- **Biblical Basis:** Described in Luke 2:22-40, where the prophetess Anna recognizes Jesus as the Redeemer and Light for the Gentiles.

Cultural Celebrations in Mexico

- **End of Christmas:** Candelaria marks the final day of the Christmas season, 40 days after December 25.
- **Rosca de Reyes Connection:** Those who found the Baby Jesus figurine in their Rosca de Reyes (Three Kings' Cake) are responsible for hosting a gathering on this day.
- **Tamales & Atole:** Hosts provide tamales (made from corn) and atole (a warm drink) for guests, combining Indigenous agricultural traditions with the feast.
- **Dressing the Baby Jesus:** Many families dress their Baby Jesus figurines in elaborate clothes and bring them to church for blessings.
- **Fusion of Traditions:** The celebration merges Catholic faith with pre-Hispanic rituals, particularly those related to maize (corn) and the agricultural cycle.

Día de la Candelaria (Candlemas) – February 2

El Día de la Candelaria, o Candlemas, se celebra 40 días después de la Navidad. Esta fiesta conmemora la presentación de Jesús en el Templo y la purificación de María, según se relata en el Evangelio de Lucas. Las familias tradicionalmente llevan velas para ser bendecidas y suelen compartir tamales, combinando la tradición católica con costumbres indígenas, especialmente en México.

- **Luz de Cristo:** Las velas bendecidas simbolizan a Jesús como la Luz del Mundo, ofreciendo protección y guía espiritual en los hogares.
- **Base Bíblica:** En Lucas 2:22-40, la profetisa Ana reconoce a Jesús como el Redentor y Luz para los gentiles.

Celebraciones Culturales en México

- **Fin de la Navidad:** La Candelaria marca el último día de la temporada navideña, 40 días después del 25 de diciembre.
- **Conexión con la Rosca de Reyes:** Quienes encontraron la figurita del Niño Jesús en la Rosca de Reyes son responsables de organizar una reunión en este día.
- **Tamales y Atole:** Los anfitriones ofrecen tamales (hechos de maíz) y atole (bebida caliente), fusionando las tradiciones agrícolas indígenas con la fiesta.
- **Vestir al Niño Jesús:** Las familias a menudo visten las figuras del Niño Jesús con ropa elaborada y las llevan a la iglesia para recibir la bendición.
- **Fusión de Tradiciones:** La celebración combina la fe católica con rituales prehispánicos, especialmente los relacionados con el maíz y el ciclo agrícola.

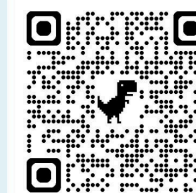

"Dei Verbum": El Papa nos recuerda que Dios se revela en la historia

Tras la catequesis del Papa León XIV, en la audiencia general del pasado miércoles, dedicada a la Constitución Dogmática Conciliar, el presidente de la Asociación Bíblica Italiana se centra en el significado más profundo del documento: «El texto permite comprender la perspectiva correcta a través de la cual la Iglesia ha repensado su misión en el mundo».

Una larga gestación

El padre Maurizio Girolami recordó que Dios se revela a través de palabras auténticas y hechos concretos, como destacó el Papa León XIV en su catequesis, subrayando también la importancia de la oración. La constitución Dei Verbum, aprobada el 18 de noviembre de 1965, fue fruto de un largo proceso de reflexión, siendo uno de los primeros textos presentados durante la preparación del Concilio Vaticano II.

El contexto histórico-cultural

Los Padres Conciliares reflexionaron sobre cómo comprender la revelación cristiana: no solo como palabras escritas, sino como una historia viva hecha de palabras y acontecimientos. En un contexto marcado por la Ilustración y el positivismo, el Concilio afirmó que el cristianismo no es solo la religión del libro, sino el encuentro con Cristo vivo, transmitido por la Sagrada Escritura, la Tradición y la vida de la Iglesia.

El proceso de renovación

La Dei Verbum proporcionó el fundamento teológico del Concilio Vaticano II, ayudando a la Iglesia a repensar su misión, el valor de la Sagrada Escritura y la Tradición, y la forma de vivir la fe hoy. Según el padre Maurizio Girolami, este documento es la base del proceso de renovación conciliar, que influyó en la liturgia, el lenguaje pastoral y las estructuras de la Iglesia, dando profundidad a la evangelización actual.

Archbishop Grušas: Pray for peace during Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

Amid ongoing threats to peace worldwide, Archbishop Gintaras Grušas, President of the Council of European Bishops' Conferences, invites Christians to pray for peace during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, held annually on 18-25 January.

Archbishop Gintaras Grušas, President of the Council of European Bishops' Conferences (CCEE), is urging prayers for peace in our war-torn world following the signing of the updated Charta Oecumenica in Rome on 5 November 2025.

In a letter to European bishops, Archbishop Grušas emphasized that prayer is the soul of the ecumenical movement and called for renewed focus on unity among Christians as a powerful instrument of peace. He highlighted the importance of this prayer especially amid ongoing armed conflicts and geopolitical tensions, ahead of the 25th anniversary of the original Charta Oecumenica signed in 2001.

The revised Charta encourages the Churches to deepen ecumenical dialogue, shared prayer, common witness, and formation within their communities. Archbishop Grušas entrusted these efforts to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Europe, and the Patron Saints of Europe, hoping that unity may extend beyond Christians to all parties in conflict. The updated Charta Oecumenica marks a significant milestone in European ecumenism and remains a key reference for fostering cooperation and witness among Christian Churches across the continent.

Open Doors: Number of Christians persecuted worldwide rises to 388 million

As Open Doors releases its World Watch List 2026, reporting a new record in violence against Christians, Cristian Nani, the association's director, tells Vatican News that many of the victims were women and minors, noting particular concern for sub-Saharan Africa.

Violence and discrimination

The World Watch List 2026 reports that the number of countries experiencing extreme anti-Christian persecution has risen from 13 to 15. North Korea remains the most dangerous country for Christians, while others with alarming levels of persecution include Somalia, Eritrea, Libya, Afghanistan, Yemen, Sudan, Mali, Nigeria, Pakistan, Iran, India, Saudi Arabia, Myanmar, and Syria. Syria has moved from a "high" to an extreme level of persecution, with only 300,000 Christians remaining, hundreds of thousands fewer than a decade ago, due to ongoing political instability and recent clashes in Aleppo.

Attacks in Nigeria

During the presentation of the World Watch List 2026 in Rome, witness accounts highlighted the growing insecurity in northern Nigeria. Recent incidents include 14 Christians killed by the Islamic State West Africa Province (ISWAP) in Adamawa State on December 29, and dozens more attacked by unidentified armed men at a marketplace in Dema, Niger State, on January 4. Many local Christians expressed fear of possible reprisals following the US Christmas raid.

From The *Paster*

"Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world."
John 1:29-34

Dear Brothers and Sisters: One more time this Sunday, we hear the words John the Baptist expressed while contemplating Jesus coming to him. I truly believe that when the Body of Christ is presented to you during the Holy Sacrifice of the Eucharist, as good Catholics you should have a clear understanding of who is being presented to you. The lamb is a messianic image used by the prophets—especially Isaiah—and one that is known to all faithful Israelites. The Father of the Church also tells us that the Lamb of God is a sign of humility, purity, simplicity, goodness, gentleness and innocence. Again, what should our attitude be when we come enter the communion line and see him coming to us poor sinners? You are right: Humility! The same humility that is shown by John the Baptist and Jesus in today's Gospel.

Why is it important to talk about this repeatedly? Because the opposite is pride, and to be sincere it is a capital sin which has become predominant in our times, even among ourselves. The reason we become prideful is because we don't know Him. The reason we don't humble ourselves is because we believe that we are right in everything, and nobody can tell us anything. This is even worse than our present state of disgrace. Today John the Baptist becomes an example for us of true humility when he says: "I did not know him, but the reason why I came baptizing with water was that he might be made known to Israel" John 1:31. What is the main and most important reason for our missions and ministries? It should be bringing others to come to the knowledge of God. Instead, we are building our own kingdoms and become slaves of a serious sin that opposes the virtue of humility. This is pride!

The Cure of Ars taught that humility is the essential foundation for all other virtues, comparing it to the chain in a rosary. Remove humility, and virtues fall away. He emphasized daily prayer for humility, recognizing our nothingness, and seeing it as key to spiritual life, peace and union with God.

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist keeps inviting us to consider ourselves of little value in our thoughts, words, and actions, so that we may be exalted to sing the praises of God for all eternity! Being in the company of pharisees, Jesus noticed that many of them boasted of their good deeds, and despised others. Oh, my dear brethren, this is our daily temptation—to believe that we are better than others, holier than others, more knowledgeable than others, more worthy and perfect than others. What a tragedy. This is the path to hell or eternal damnation. Today we are invited to consider the virtue of humility more seriously, especially when we approach to receive communion.

Saint Teresa of Avila asked the Lord why the Holy Spirit had enlightened and listened more to the prayers of the patriarchs and prophets in ancient times, and why it seems that he did not listen to us today. His response was that it was because of the great virtue of humility they had.

On the contrary in our time, we are more stubborn, and when someone corrects us insofar as our pride, instead of changing we become angry, offended and defensive. Our actions sometimes reflect our false humility, and we even use derogative words toward ourselves to appear humbler. But in the end, we became guilty of the same grievous sin.

We must look to our Divine Redeemer again, who comes all the way down and meets us in our misery to save us. May we follow his example of humility and love for humanity. Saint Augustine tells us: If you ask me which is the first virtue for a Christian, I will tell you that it is humility. If you ask me again which is the second, I will say to you it is humility. If you again ask me which is the third, I will say that it is humility. According to Saint John Maria Vianey, if pride produces every sin, we can just as well say that humility produces every virtue. With humility you have the means to please God and save your soul; without humility all the other virtues will be of no avail.

Finally, in today's Psalm we sing to the Lord: "Here am I Lord, I come to do your will" Psalm 40:9. The first one to teach us how to do God's will is Jesus! "Sacrifice or offering you wished not but ears open to obedience you gave me" Psalm 40:6-8. The first one to teach us obedience to God's will is Jesus. Who are you following, to whom you are listening, who are you imitating? I hope it is Jesus.

Del *Paster*

He aquí el Cordero de Dios, que quita el pecado del mundo.»
Juan 1, 29-34

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo: Una vez más este domingo escuchamos las palabras que Juan el Bautista pronunció al contemplar a Jesús que venía hacia él. Creo firmemente que, cuando el Cuerpo de Cristo se les presenta durante el Santo Sacrificio de la Eucaristía, como buenos católicos debemos tener una clara comprensión de quién es el que se nos presenta. El cordero es una imagen mesiánica utilizada por los profetas—especialmente Isaías—y bien conocida por todos los fieles israelitas. Los Padres de la Iglesia nos enseñan también que el Cordero de Dios es signo de humildad, pureza, sencillez, bondad, mansedumbre e inocencia. Entonces, ¿cuál debería ser nuestra actitud cuando entramos en la fila para la Comunión y lo vemos venir hacia nosotros, pobres pecadores? Tienen razón: humildad. La misma humildad que manifiestan Juan el Bautista y Jesús en el Evangelio de hoy. ¿Por qué es importante hablar de esto repetidamente? Porque lo contrario es el orgullo, y siendo sinceros, es un pecado capital que se ha vuelto predominante en nuestros tiempos, incluso entre nosotros mismos.

El orgullo surge porque no lo conocemos a Él. No nos humillamos porque creemos que siempre tenemos la razón y que nadie puede corregirnos. Esto es aún peor que nuestro estado presente de desgracia. Hoy, Juan el Bautista se convierte para nosotros en un verdadero ejemplo de humildad cuando dice: «Yo no lo conocía, pero he venido a bautizar con agua para que Él fuera manifestado a Israel» (Jn 1,31). ¿Cuál es la razón principal y más importante de nuestras misiones y ministerios? Debería ser llevar a otros al conocimiento de Dios. Sin embargo, muchas veces estamos construyendo nuestros propios reinos y nos volvemos esclavos de un pecado grave que se opone a la virtud de la humildad: el orgullo.

El Santo Cura de Ars enseñaba que la humildad es el fundamento esencial de todas las demás virtudes, comparándola con el hilo que mantiene unidas las cuentas del rosario. Si se quita la humildad, las virtudes se pierden. Él enfatizaba la oración diaria para pedir humildad, reconociendo nuestra nada, viéndola como clave para la vida espiritual, la paz y la unión con Dios.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Juan el Bautista nos sigue invitando a considerarnos pequeños en nuestros pensamientos, palabras y acciones, para que podamos ser exaltados y cantar las alabanzas de Dios por toda la eternidad. Estando entre fariseos, Jesús notó que muchos se jactaban de sus buenas obras y despreciaban a los demás. Ay, queridos hermanos, esta es nuestra tentación diaria: creer que somos mejores que otros, más santos, más sabios, más dignos y más perfectos. ¡Qué tragedia! Este es el camino hacia el infierno o la condenación eterna. Hoy se nos invita a tomar más en serio la virtud de la humildad, especialmente cuando nos acercamos a comulgar.

Santa Teresa de Jesús preguntó al Señor por qué el Espíritu Santo había iluminado y escuchado más las oraciones de los patriarcas y profetas en tiempos antiguos, y por qué pareciera que hoy no nos escucha de la misma manera. El Señor le respondió que era por la gran virtud de la humildad que ellos poseían. En cambio, en nuestro tiempo somos más tercos y, cuando alguien nos corrige en lo que toca a nuestro orgullo, en lugar de cambiar nos molestamos, nos ofendemos y nos ponemos a la defensiva. A veces nuestras acciones reflejan una falsa humildad, incluso usando palabras despectivas sobre nosotros mismos para aparentar ser humildes, pero al final caemos en el mismo pecado grave. Debemos volver a mirar a nuestro Divino Redentor, que desciende hasta encontrarnos en nuestra miseria para salvarnos. Que sigamos su ejemplo de humildad y amor por la humanidad. San Agustín nos dice: «Si me preguntas cuál es la primera virtud del cristiano, te responderé que es la humildad; si me preguntas cuál es la segunda, te diré que es la humildad; y si me preguntas cuál es la tercera, te diré que también es la humildad.» Según San Juan María Vianey, si el orgullo produce todo pecado, podemos decir igualmente que la humildad produce toda virtud. Con la humildad tenemos los medios para agradar a Dios y salvar nuestra alma; sin humildad, todas las demás virtudes no sirven de nada. Finalmente, en el Salmo de hoy cantamos al Señor:

«Aquí estoy, Señor, para hacer tu voluntad» (Salmo 40,9).
El primero en enseñarnos a hacer la voluntad de Dios es Jesús: «No quisiste sacrificios ni ofrendas, pero me abriste el oído» (Salmo 40,6-8).
El primero en enseñarnos la obediencia a la voluntad del Padre es Jesús. ¿A quién estás siguiendo? ¿A quién estás escuchando? ¿A quién estás imitando? Espero que sea a Jesús.

Fabian was Pope for 14 years. He maintained relations with Eastern Christians, and divided Rome into seven diaconates for the assistance of the poor. Pope Fabian was imprisoned during the Decian persecution and died in 250. He is buried in the catacombs of St Callixtus, and is honoured as a martyr.
