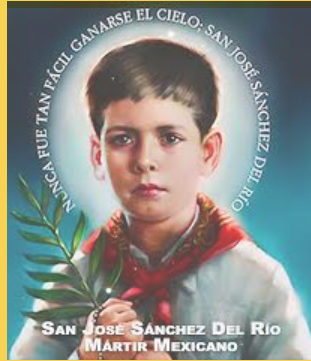



La propuesta de León XIV es una transición necesaria: pasar de la "lógica del consumo egoísta a una cultura de solidaridad". Esto implica, concretamente, promover gestos como el apoyo a bancos de alimentos, campañas de sensibilización y la adopción de estilos de vida más sobrios y responsables.

Pope Leo: Church must bear witness to truth in charity

Meeting with a delegation of the German Archdiocese of Cologne, Pope Leo XIV encourages the Church in all countries to offer mutual support for other dioceses and to bear witness to the truth in charity.

Pope Leo XIV met on Thursday with the Diocesan Office for the Universal Church and Dialogue, as it celebrates the 50th anniversary of its creation within the Archdiocese of Cologne, in Germany.

He said the occasion provides an opportunity to reflect on the universality of the Church and the importance of dialogue. "In light of Christ's Resurrection, the Church recognizes herself as being sent to all peoples—not by imposing herself, but by bearing witness to the truth in charity," he said. "Dialogue, in turn, strengthens communion, opens paths of understanding, and serves the cause of peace."

Through the work of dialogue and communion, Christ makes the Church a sign of unity and hope for the world, drawing all things to Himself.

Pope Leo praised the Archdiocese of Cologne for its "prophetic openness" to the Church's universal dimension, which he said is expressed in a willingness for "encounter, mutual exchange, and dialogue."

He recalled that the Archdiocese established a partnership with the Archdiocese of Tokyo in 1954 and set up several aid initiatives, including Misereor and Adveniat.

"This vision of the Church as truly universal—called to solidarity beyond the confines of Europe, and sustained through a culture of dialogue—remains at the very heart of your organization's identity," he said.

The Archdiocese of Cologne also became a founding member of the Meeting of Aid Agencies for the Eastern Churches (ROACO), which offers support for the Eastern Churches and helps provide aid to regions affected by famine, flooding, and war.

Other initiatives promoted by the Archdiocese include providing scholarships for seminarians and assistance to elderly priests.

Pope Leo recalled that the Archdiocese of Cologne supported several initiatives of the Diocese of Peru when he was its Bishop, including purchasing oxygen-producing machines which saved many lives.

"Through your generous service," he said, "the universal dimension of the Church is made visible and concrete, fostering solidarity, strengthening bonds of unity, and bearing witness to the Gospel of peace in a world so often marked by division and distress."

In conclusion, Pope Leo XIV invited the Archdiocese of Cologne to continue its mission of charity, especially its support for Christians in the Middle East and those who have been forced to flee their homelands.

"I encourage you," he said, "to persevere in this mission of charity, so that they may still experience the closeness of the universal Church."

From The *Paster*

"Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip?" John 14:1-12
Christ is risen!

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

After accepting with humility that we still have a long way to come to the knowledge of Christ, now we must together come to the decision to help one another in this important endeavor. How can we better come to the knowledge of Christ? It is in our personal and communal prayer and through Scripture and the meditation of the Gospels. By opening the eyes of our hearts, we may also discover his presence in the Eucharist and in our brothers and sisters. On the other hand, the Lord offers us some encouragement; he is the one who asks us not to let our hearts be troubled.

Oh, my dear Brethren, how many things trouble us? The state of the world can sometimes be overwhelming. But amidst these difficulties and sufferings, Jesus asks us to trust him rather than be overwhelmed by the feeling of being alone or abandoned by God.

How can we give an answer to the problem of evil in our times; to the remaining existentialism, to the injustices and nonsensical situations of our daily lives? The answer is faith and trust in God. Jesus said, "Have faith in my Father and have faith in me" John 14:1. It is Jesus who teaches us how to trust in the Father. He consoles us and reminds us that he is with us.

True Consolation is Jesus's peace from "empty words" or false consolation. Jesus does not say, "you will not suffer," but rather, "I am close to you," offering a peace that is not anesthesia, but a calming presence amidst suffering. Tell him what makes you suffer; tell him what is happening in your life. Have you experienced the ingratitude of people, the betrayal of someone, the dissolution of someone whom you trust, the rejection of others, the misunderstanding of those around you? Do not be troubled. Jesus is with you.

The goal is not to ignore our problems or become emotionally numb, but to have a heart that is at peace and trusting while living through difficulties. Be strong and trust in God! This world requires peace makers. But how can we contribute to the mission of the Church if we don't accept Christ's peace? If we don't do so we become troublemakers, and this is not our mission.

I truly invite you as family of faith to look around and find out for yourself how Jesus's presence is real. Don't put limits to God's action in your life. He is truly risen, he is truly present and he is in action.

I offer a special thanks to God for those people who became Catholics during our Easter Vigil. And congratulations to our brothers and sisters who are to be confirmed today. Congratulations to the many children of our parish who recently made their First Communions. Also, congratulations to those who got married recently, and those who are getting married in the coming weeks and months! This is a visible sign of God's presence. I thank Minette Connelly, Bod Miyagishima and a group of others who go with me to the nursing home every Sunday; for their support, love, and kindness towards those who are part of our parish. To the home bound ministry, including Janet Alvarado and Joe Gallegos; as I contemplate them working anonymously, their dedication reminds me that through them and in them God is in action!

I thank Jesus for revealing the Father to us and reminding us how he cares for us. We are not fatherless; he has revealed to us the face of the Father and their intrinsic union—a unity that should exist among ourselves. He tells us: "Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else, believe because of the works themselves" John 14:11.

Let us learn from this: What are our actions telling us? What are your words telling us? Sometimes actions speak louder than words. If we understand today's message, let us humbly realize that by our fruits people will know that we are Christians who follow Christ—who is not just an idea, but the son of God—the Truth the Way and the Life!

Del *Paster*

"¿Hace tanto que estoy con ustedes y todavía no me conoces, Felipe?" Juan 14: 1-12
¡Cristo ha resucitado!

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Después de aceptar con humildad que aún nos falta mucho para llegar al pleno conocimiento de Cristo, ahora debemos decidir juntos ayudarnos mutuamente en este importante camino. ¿Cómo podemos llegar mejor al conocimiento de Cristo? Es en nuestra oración personal y comunitaria, en la Sagrada Escritura y en la meditación de los Evangelios. Abriendo los ojos del corazón, también podemos descubrir su presencia en la Eucaristía y en nuestros hermanos y hermanas. Por otra parte, el Señor nos ofrece ánimo; es Él quien nos pide que no se turbe nuestro corazón. Oh, mis queridos hermanos, ¡cuántas cosas nos inquietan! El estado del mundo puede ser, a veces, abrumador. Pero en medio de estas dificultades y sufrimientos, Jesús nos pide confiar en Él, en lugar de dejarnos dominar por el sentimiento de estar solos o abandonados por Dios.

¿Cómo podemos responder al problema del mal en nuestros tiempos; al existencialismo persistente, a las injusticias y a las situaciones sin sentido de nuestra vida diaria? La respuesta es la fe y la confianza en Dios. Jesús dijo: «Tengan fe en mi Padre y tengan fe también en mí» (Juan 14, 1). Es Jesús quien nos enseña a confiar en el Padre. Él nos consuela y nos recuerda que está con nosotros. La verdadera consolación es la paz de Jesús, distinta de las "palabras vacías" o de la falsa consolación. Jesús no dice: «no sufrirán», sino más bien: «estoy cerca de ustedes», ofreciendo una paz que no es anestesia, sino una presencia serena en medio del sufrimiento. Cuéntale lo que te hace sufrir; cuéntale lo que está pasando en tu vida. ¿Has experimentado la ingratitud de las personas, la traición de alguien, la desilusión de alguien en quien confiabas, el rechazo de otros, la incompreensión de quienes te rodean? No te turbes. Jesús está contigo.

El objetivo no es ignorar nuestros problemas ni volvernos emocionalmente insensibles, sino tener un corazón en paz y confiado mientras atravesamos las dificultades. ¡Sé fuerte y confía en Dios! Este mundo necesita constructores de paz. Pero ¿cómo podemos contribuir a la misión de la Iglesia si no aceptamos la paz de Cristo? Si no lo hacemos, nos convertimos en generadores de conflicto, y esa no es nuestra misión.

Los invito verdaderamente, como familia de fe, a mirar a su alrededor y descubrir por ustedes mismos cuán real es la presencia de Jesús. No pongan límites a la acción de Dios en sus vidas. Él verdaderamente ha resucitado, verdaderamente está presente y verdaderamente está actuando.

Ofrezco un agradecimiento especial a Dios por aquellas personas que se hicieron católicas durante nuestra Vigilia Pascual. Y felicito a nuestros hermanos y hermanas que serán confirmados hoy. ¡Felicidades a los muchos niños de nuestra parroquia que recientemente hicieron su Primera Comunión! También, felicitaciones a quienes se casaron recientemente y a quienes se casarán en las próximas semanas y meses. Esto es un signo visible de la presencia de Dios.

Agradezco a Minette Connelly, Bod Miyagishima y a un grupo de personas que me acompañan al asilo cada domingo; por su apoyo, amor y bondad hacia quienes forman parte de nuestra parroquia. A los miembros del ministerio a los enfermos y confinados en casa, incluyendo a Janet Alvarado y Joe Gallegos; al contemplarlos trabajar en el anonimato, su dedicación me recuerda que a través de ellos y en ellos ¡Dios está actuando!

Doy gracias a Jesús por revelarnos al Padre y recordarnos cuánto cuida de nosotros. No estamos huérfanos; Él nos ha revelado el rostro del Padre y su unión intrínseca—una unidad que también debe existir entre nosotros. 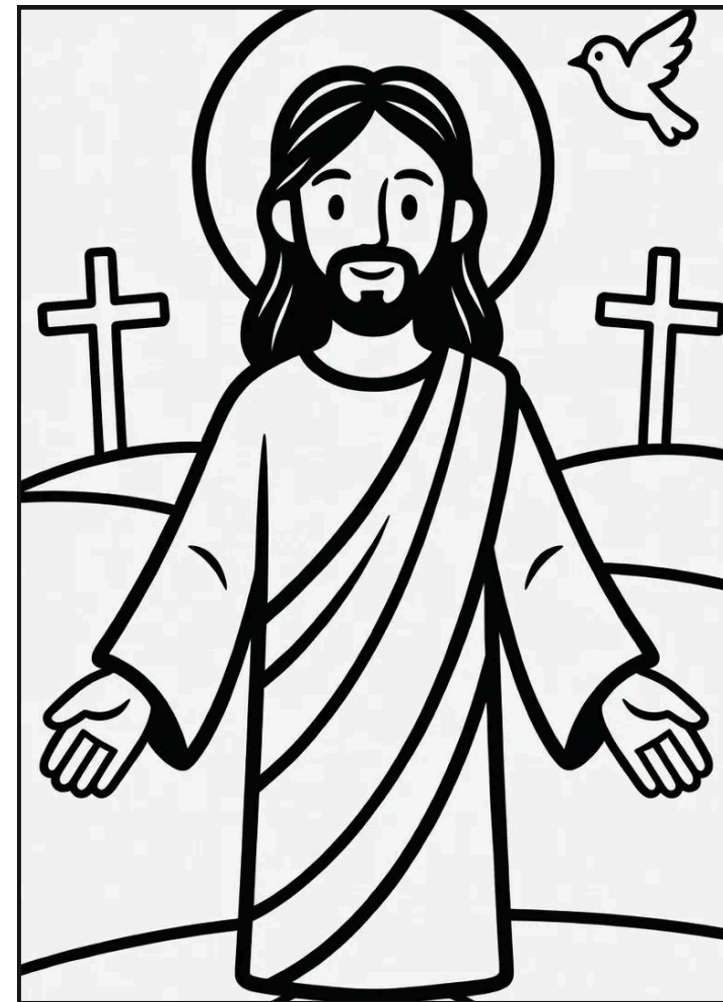

Saint of the Day / Santo del dia

s. Nuncio Sulpricio, joven obrero de Nápoles



"Estad siempre con el Señor, porque todo lo bueno viene de Él. Sufrid por amor de Dios y con alegría".
 Hay pocos años de serenidad en la breve vida de este santo. Nuncio nació en Abruzzo y a los seis años ya era huérfano de padre y madre. Confiado a su querida abuela materna, con ella aprendió a ir a misa y a conocer a Jesús, madurando dentro de sí un fuerte deseo de hacerse cada vez más semejante a él. A los nueve años, su abuela murió y el tío que debería haberlo protegido, en cambio lo forzó a trabajar en su herrería, muy poco apta para un niño de esa edad. Fue allí donde la vida de Nuncio comenzó a seguir y a imitar el doloroso camino de Jesús hacia la cruz.

Una vida sellada por el sufrimiento

Nuncio se muestra fuerte, hasta el final. Consuela al Coronel - que ahora lo llama "mi papá" - con la certeza de la promesa de que los dos podrán algún día abrazarse de nuevo en el cielo. Estamos en 1836 y la situación es ahora desesperada: Nuncio sufre fiebres muy altas que afronta rezando y ofreciendo su sufrimiento por las conversiones y por la Iglesia. La muerte lo libera del dolor el 5 de mayo, cuando acababa de cumplir 19 años, pero no sin antes recibir los Sacramentos. Alrededor de su cuerpo, consumado por las llagas, se difunde un intenso perfume de rosas. Ver artículo completo en:

St. Nunzio Sulprizio, young worker of Naples

VATICAN CITY — Blessed Nunzio Sulprizio, who died at the age of 19 from bone cancer, will be declared a saint Oct. 14 during the Synod of Bishops on Young People, Faith and Vocational Discernment (to take place Oct. 3-28) in Rome, Pope Francis announced Thursday.

The Pope announced the date of the young Italian's canonization during an ordinary public consistory at the Vatican July 19. The canonization will take place alongside six others, including those of Blesseds Oscar Romero and Pope Paul VI, who presided over Sulprizio's beatification.

At the beatification Dec. 1, 1963, Paul VI said that Blessed Nunzio teaches us that "the period of youth should not be considered the age of free passions, of inevitable falls, of invincible crises, of decadent pessimism, of harmful selfishness. Rather, he will tell you how being young is a grace."

"He will tell you that no other age than yours, young people, is as suitable for great ideals, for generous heroism, for the coherent demands of thought and action," the Pope continued.

"He will teach you how you, young people, can regenerate the world in which Providence has called you to live, and how it is up to you first to consecrate yourselves for the salvation of a society that needs strong and fearless souls."

Besides Paul VI and Oscar Romero, the other canonizations to take place Oct. 14 are of Blesseds Francesco Spinelli, a diocesan priest and founder of the Institute of the Adorers of the Blessed Sacrament; Vincenzo Romano, a diocesan priest from Torre de Greco in Italy; Maria Caterina Kasper, a German nun and founder of the Institute of the Poor Handmaids of Jesus Christ; and Nazaria Ignazia of St. Teresa of Jesus, founder of the Congregation of the Misioneras Cruzadas de la Iglesia Sisters.
